Minutes of the

60th Annual Session

Florida DeMolay Association

Tuesday, August 10, 1993 9:00 A.M.

The regular business session of the 60th Annual Conclave of the Florida DeMolay Association was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Brother Samuel A. Miller, State Master Councilor. Brother Miller turned the Chair over to Brother Jason Turner, Credentials Committee Chairmen. Brother Turner then took roll call and a Delegate Count was taken. The count was:

Total Delegate Count: 83 Simple Majority: 42 Two-Thirds Majority: 56

Brother Chris Gonzalez, Paul Revere Chapter, then moved that the delegation hold over all reports not ready at the opening of a session to the next session. Brother John Bockover, Haven Chapter seconded the motion. The motion was then passed by the delegation.

Brother Turner then gave the following report:

CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE 08/10/93

To the Delegates of the 60th Annual Conclave:

The Credentials Committee has met and the credentials of all Delegates have been validated in accordance with Section 5.05 of the Statutes.

This year, at the 60th Annual Conclave, there are 26 Chapters registered for a total 78 delegate votes, with 5 State Officers votes, a total of 83 delegate votes. Assuming that all Delegates are present at a session, a majority would be 42, and a two-thirds majority vote would be 56. A quorum to conduct a session is 42.

Last years recommendation asked that Delegate registration forms be sent to the chapter along with the Conclave registration form. This was not implemented. Instead this years committee decided to have forms at the Conclave Office to be signed by Chapter Dads upon arrival at Conclave.

This years recommendation is as follows:

In consideration of the effectiveness of placing forms at the Conclave Office on the first day of Conclave, we feel is extremely important to continue doing this in the future.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes of this association, this report is physically and fiscally feasible.

Brother Mark Griffis, Brandon Chapter, objected to Section 1. Brother Chris Gonzalez, Paul Revere Chapter, moved to pass all un-objected portions of the report. Brother Mark Griffis seconded the motion. The un-objected portions of the report were then passed.

Brother Griffis then explained his objection to Brother Turner.

Brother Turner discussed this with Brother Griffis and he removed his objection. Brother Griffis then moved to pass the report as read. Brother Chris Gonzalez, Paul Revere Chapter, seconded the motion. The report was accepted as read.

Brother Miller then called on Brother Buddy Rudolph, Chairman of the Guidance Committee, who read the following report:

GUIDANCE COMMITTEE 08/09/93

To the Delegates of the 60th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the Guidance Committee, have met and submit the following report for your approval;

This committee recommended to the State Master Councilor, that all of the S.M.C.R.'s contact the State Master Councilor at least twice a month, either by phone, mail, or in person, whichever is more convenient to each S.M.C.R. Not including their regular monthly reports. This recommendation was not implemented by the State Master Councilor.

This committee recommended to the State Master Councilor, that all S.M.C.R.'s help create a Zone Planning and Communication Committee. This Committee will be headed by the S.M.C.R.(s) and will consist of all of the Master Councilors of their Zone. The purpose of this committee is to help plan Chapter and Zone functions including the fall and spring area plan Chapters. Furthermore, to improve communications between the Zone and the Chapters. This was implemented by some of the Zones, but not by all.

This committee recommended to the State Master Councilor, that along with the S.M.C.R.'s Chapter reports that are turned in to their designated State Officer, that they include a list of the future activities within their Zone, in a reasonable amount of time. To help the State Officers in scheduling their travel to that particular Zone.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes of this Association, this report is physically and fiscally feasible.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PUBLICATIONS 08/10/93

To the Delegates of the 60th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the Public Relations and Publications committee, have met and submit the following report for your approval:

A) Last year's Recommendation #1 recommended that more DeMolays in the state of Florida be included on the mailing list of the State Newsletter. This committee believes that this recommendation was well carried out but due to the fact that some DeMolays didn't know exactly who to send their addresses to in order to get on the list, several DeMolays were left off of the list. For those DeMolays that are still unsure who to send their addresses to, send them to:

- B) Last year's Recommendation #2 recommended that Chapters be urged to submit reports of events in their Chapters and Zones. This committee implemented this but very few chapters took advantage of this new resource so we recommend that this recommendation be further implemented in the future. This committee should submit the reports to the State Newsletter.
- C) Last year's Recommendation #3 recommended that a variety of articles be included in the State Newsletter. This committee feels that this recommendation was not implemented very well although the spectrum of articles was increased. This committee believes that with the assistance of both the members and advisors, this recommendation can be better implemented in the future.
- D) Last year's Recommendation #4 recommended that an area of the State Newsletter be reserved for articles and/or comments of the leaders of appendant bodies. This committee feels that these appendant bodies (ADVISORY COUNCILS, COURT OF CHEVALIERS, KNIGHTHOOD, MOTHER'S/PARENT'S CLUB, DEMOLAY CLUBS, ALUMNI ASSOCIATION, LEGION OF HONOR PRECEPTORIES) did not take advantage of this mainly because this committee did not publicize this well enough so these bodies were not aware that they had this space.

This committee now submits the following recommendations for your approval;

1. This committee recommends that if any further Activity Programs are put out by any future State Master Councilors that a section of the booklet should list and encourage the members to use the available ISC materials in/on publicizing the Order of DeMolay within their communities.

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- 2. This committee feels that a question and answer column should be plac. in the State Newsletter. This would give the members a place to get multiple points of view on how to handle certain situations.
- 3. This committee recommends that our successors prepare a format for chapter newspapers that they could send to the chapters throughout the state. We feel that this will encourage more chapter newspapers which will in turn, inform the members of up-coming chapter events.
- 4. This committee recommends that our successors create a list of ways for the chapters throughout the state to publicize the Order in their communities and that the committee review it each year. The ideas must be of a wide range so that every chapter can find ideas in the list of suggestions that are plausible for the differing areas and situations. This would almost certainly increase membership as well as promote the image of DeMolay if carried out correctly.
- 5. This committee recommends that S.M.C.R.'s implement a program to publish a Zone Newsletter that would publicize and communicate chapter activities within the zone to help improve inner-zone communication.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes of the Florida DeMolay Association this report bears no fiscal or physical impact.

KNIGHTHOOD COMMITTEE 08/09/93

To the Delegates of the 60th Annual Conclave;

In accordance with the State Master Councilor's plan, Knighthood has embarked on an activities oriented program over the last year. The results stand to demonstrate the effectiveness of such a program.

Education is one of the primary goals of Knighthood. As a result, one of the most popular activities of the Order is providing a variety of interesting course topics for the John Bates University. Over four-fifths of the classes offered are now being taught by Sir Knights. In addition, all of the sessions are being recorded to form a library of classes that can be used as a reference for those interested.

Participation in state activities has increased over the last year. Attendance by DeMolays and Sir Knights at the Grand Master's Class on March 5-7 showed a 225% increase. Annual State Knighthood events have also been created, such as the Convocation that took place from July 17-18th, the Illustrious Knight Commander Banquet, scheduled for October 9th, and the Priory Princess Ball, scheduled for December 4th. A Drill Team has been formed in the Jupiter-Miami area to honor distinguished guests at such activities. Knighthood Ritual Competition will begin at Mini-Conclave, acknowledging and encouraging the excellence in ritual that is vital to survival.

Since 1985, the International Supreme Council has awarded only six Green Honor Keys globally to Knights that invested 15 or more members into the Order. Of these six, three have been earned within our Priory during the last year. The three recipients have contributed to the 729% increase in the number of new Squires and Sir Knights from 1992 to 1993. The Squire Program is still succeeding in raising the level of DeMolay excellence. There was a 1550% increase in the number that met the rigid requirements to be elevated from a Squire to a Sir Knight.

As a result of the efforts in these activities and the ensuing growth in Knighthood, the State Charter for the Priory was presented on May 15th, 1993.

In accordance with Section 5.01 of the Statutes, this report is both physically and fiscally feasible.

Fraternally, Ron A. DeLucia, Chairman, Knighthood Committee Brother Judd Greer, George Ulee Lord, moved the acceptance of the report as read, Bro. Griffis seconded and motion carried.

Brother Miller invited Brother Scott Holland to preside, he then gave the following report;

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE 08/08/93

To the Delegates of the 60th Annual Conclave;

We, the members of the 1992-1993 Executive Committee make the following report regarding last year's recommendations;

A) Recommendation #1 stated that each chapter should send at least one young man to LTC and Region 3 Grand Master's Class. This recommendation was implemented by only a few chapters, but this committee feels that is

should be pushed and promoted in the future.

B) Recommendation #2 stated that all committee chairmen should keep in close contact with the SMC and that all committee reports be distributed at the State Staff Conclave Review Session to improve communication. There was definitely more contact between the SMC and the committee chairmen this year than in previous years. We feel though, that more communication is needed in the future to maximize the potential of the committees. The part regarding the distribution of committee reports to state staff members was not implemented last year but we believe that if it were implemented it would be of great benefit.

C) Recommendation #3 stated that the chairman of this committee and the chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee form a tentative schedule for all delegate sessions. This recommendation was not implemented, but we believe that any communication and planning between the committee chairmen is

beneficial.

This year's committee has the following recommendation;

1) This committee recommends that next year's SMC and Constitutional Revisions Committee Chairman examine the use of the Delegate Sessions Rules Committee and the possibility of adding it to the list of Standing Committees already in the Constitution.

2) This committee recommends that the SMC have monthly communication

with the Committee Chairmen to examine their progress.

In accordance with Section 5.01 of the Statutes, this report is both physically and fiscally feasible.

The Letter of Intent will be read aloud before the DeMolay Delegation by the Nominations Committee Chairman prior to elections.

to elections. change "opening Delegate Session" to "Official Opening" Section 3.01: Any qualified DeMolay who desires to run for an elective office of this Association shall send a letter of intent to the Executive Officer and Chairman of the Nominations Committee, prior to the Official Opening of Conclave. Section 3.11(b): The State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Parliamentarian, and the State Scribe/Treasurer will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave. insert "Deputy State Master Councilor," between "The" and "State Senior Councilor"

Section 3.11(b): The Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Parliamentarian, and the State Scribe/Treasurer will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave.

Section 5.12: The Guidance Committee shall be the duly appointed State Master Councilor's Representatives of the several Zones. This Committee will function at the will of the State Master Councilor. It shall act in an advisory capacity to relay to the State Master Councilor the suggested needs of the individual Zones and the State as a whole. This committee shall physically meet at least twice before the opening session of the Annual Conclave.

Bro. Gonzales moved a reconsideration of the Credentials Committee

report, Bro. Griffis seconded the motion.

25 Chapters registered for a total of 75 delegates, 5 State Officers. 41 needed for a quorum to conduct business.

Brother Holland was asked to preside so that Bro. Miller could read the report of the Membership Committee for Brother John Bucemi who was ill.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE 08/11/93

To the Delegates of the 60th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the Membership Committee, submit the following report for your approval;

This year's Membership Committee, under the advisement of the State Master Councilor, fulfilled the following duties;

a) collect suggestions from the state appointed line officers on how to improve Membership in this state.

b) promote Membership in the context of the SMC's program.

c) submit reports to the SMC regarding the suggestions that were attained and ideas on their implementation.

Regarding last year's recommendations;

A) Recommendation #1 - The Chairman, SMC, and State Membership Advisor should attempt to be in close contact with each other at least once a month by mail or phone. This was implemented but not to the degree that the committee feels that it should have been done, we feel that the aforementioned contacts should be strengthened.

B) Recommendation #2 - The Chairman of this committee should be responsible for writing a membership editorial in the state newspaper. This was not implemented in the past year due to a lack of effective

communication but the committee feels it should be done

C) Recommendation #3 - We suggest that the SMC should send a letter of congratulations to a chapter that reaches 50%, 75%, and 100% of their membership goal and individuals who receive their Founder's Membership Award or Blue Honor Key during his term. This was not done but this committee feels that the aforementioned parties deserve some recognition.

D) Recommendation #4 - The Chairman of this committee, the SMC, and the State Membership Advisor should set up a state initiation at a convenient time. This recommendation was not implemented in the past year

but the committee feels that it should be done.

E) Recommendation #5 - This committee feels that each zone should have monthly initiations, competitions, social events, and meetings for the benefit of all chapters whatever their size. This was not done by all zones this year, and this committee feels that monthly meetings are not physically feasible for some zones due to the limitations of geography.

This year's committee makes the following recommendations for your

approval;

1) The Membership Chairman should receive a copy of the monthly ISC membership report, and a copy of the State Directory. This would aid him in investigating membership problems within each chapter for future reports.

2) The Membership Committee in the future should consist of at least one representative from each zone, possibly the SMCR's as they are in the

best position to report on the zone as a whole.

3) Each issue of the state newspaper should include a section honoring those chapters which have reached their membership goals and the individuals who have earned their Founder's Membership Award or Blue Honor The necessary information could be obtained from either the Executive Officer or the Director of ISC Awards.

4) A state initiation should be held each year, the Chairman of this committee, the SMC, and the State Membership Advisor should plan this meeting at the annual Conclave or Mini-Conclave and have plans set and announced before the closing in order to improve communication in all respects.

5) An article should accompany the membership section in the state newspaper (See recommendation #3). It should be written either by the Chairman or the DeMolay who has been the first line signer on the most petitions during the interval between publishing. The topic should be on effective recruiting techniques.

This committee also reports that during the year of 1992 the Florida DeMolay Association initiated 240 new DeMolays while 366 reached their majority, for a net loss of 126 members. Furthermore, there have been 74 initiates to date in 1993, with 288 majorities to date and 342 projected to the end of the year.

In accordance with Section 5.01 of the Statutes of this Association this committee report is both fiscally and physically feasible.

- A. Recommendation #1 from last years committee suggested that the State Association finance the way for the State champions in the Flower Talk, Ceremony of Light, Initiatory and DeMolay Degrees for competition in the Old South Tournament in Louisiana. This recommendation was not implemented. This committee feels, however, that if this recommendation is implemented in the future, it would be a great asset to all DeMolays who would otherwise not be able to attend the Old South Tournament.
- B. Recommendation #2 from last years committee stated that the Florida DeMolay Association create a certificate program similar to that of the Tournament of Champions, since the actual Tournament of Champions has been dissolved. CHARTER

The several chapters of the Order of DeMolay in Florida are hereby granted authority to form an organization to be styled "The Florida DeMolay Association". This Association shall exist to further the programs and ideals of the Order of DeMolay, to promote the progress and well-being of the Chapters and their members, and to provide a medium for education and communication throughout the Order in florida; provided that this Association shall have no authority over the particular Chapters within this Jurisdiction; provided further that this Association shall have the authority to exercise jurisdiction over State Master Councilor's Representatives and other such officers as now exist, or may in the future be created, by the Executive Officer.

To accomplish these goals, the Florida DeMolay Association shall be authorized to exact such Constitution, Statutes and Resolutions as shall not be in conflict with the policies or orders of the Executive Officer, and shall have been approved in advance by the Board of Administration.

The "Board of Administration" is hereby created to serve the Florida DeMolay Association, its officers and members, in a general advisory capacity. It shall review and approve all legislation to come before the Association, shall have original jurisdiction over any proposition of grievance arising out of the activities of the Florida DeMolay Association, and shall have the authority to construe or dispense with any provision of the Constitution, Statutes of Rules of Competition, when it shall deem such action to be in the best interest of the Order of DeMolay or this Association, and shall perform other such duties as may be enjoined upon it by the Executive Officer, and shall serve at his pleasure.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA DEMOLAY ASSOCIATION

(as revised)

Article I Name, Purpose, Colors

Section 1:

This organization shall be known as the Florida DeMolay Association, Order of DeMolay (hereinafter, Association).

Section 2:

The purposes for which this organization is formed are exclusively educational, religious, and charitable. Not by way of limitation, such purposes shall encompass guidance of DeMolays in their physical, mental, and religious development through specific programs in the fields of physical education, sportsmanship, citizenship, public speaking, and the arts, all designed to promote a keen sense of the principles of good citizenship, sportsmanship, respect for parents and fellowman, and to establish and instill a philosophy of life that will sustain the members of each Chapter in the future.

The Official colors of this Association shall be the royal colors of Purple and Gold.

Article II Allegiance and Authority

Section 1:

The Association, its Officers, Advisors, and the individuals of member Chapters of this Association pledge their allegiance to the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay, its Grand Master, Grand Secretary, and the Executive Officer in the State of Florida.

Section 2:

This body is constituted with the power and authority to set forth laws and to set forth standards in the Inter-Chapter relations: and to levy fees and dues, provided that these measures are in harmony with the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay and the Charter under which this Association operates.

Article III Membership and Representation

Section 1:

The members of this Association shall be all the Chartered Chapters, and those holding Letters Temporary, of the Order of DeMolay located in the State of Florida.

Section 2:

Section 4:

All other State Officers shall be filled by appointment of the State Master Councilor. These officers shall serve until the close of the following conclave.

Section 5(a):

No candidate shall be elected to a State Office who would reach the age of 21 years prior to his election or appointment. No State Officer may attend an out of state school or reside outside the State of Florida during his term of office. Any violation of these provisions shall automatically create a vacancy in the office.

Section 5(b):

A vacancy in an Appointed State Office may be declared by the State Master Councilor after an evaluation of that State Officer's performance.

Section 5(c):

A vacancy in an Elective State Office may be declared by the State Master Councilor after an evaluation of the State Officer's performance, and with the approval of the Executive Officer. A vacancy will also occur in the office of State Scribe/Treasurer upon recommendation and approval of the State Master Councilor to the Board of Administration.

Section 6(a):

In the event of death, resignation, or removal of a State Councilor, each lower State Councilor shall advance to the next highest office and a State Junior Councilor shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.

Section 6(b):

In the event of death, resignation, or removal of the State Parliamentarian, a new State Parliamentarian shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.

In the event of death, resignation, or removal of the State Section 6(c): Scribe/Treasurer, a new State Scribe/Treasurer shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Board of Administration or the Chairman of its behalf.

Vacancies in all other State Officers shall be filled by appointment of the State Master Councilor.

A candidates letter of intent to run for Elective State Office must include the following statement: "I have read and am familiar with the Charter, Constitution and Statutes of this Association".

All candidates for the office of State Parliamentarian must also include

the following statement: "I have read and am familiar with Robert's Rules of Order".

Article V Committees

Section 1:

The following committees shall be considered as standing committees of the Association:

- 1. Executive
- 2. Nominations
- Guidance
- 4. Credentials
- 5. Jurisprudence
- 6. Budget & Finance
- 7. Athletics
- 8. Ritual
- 9. Public Relations & Publications
- 10. Membership
- 11. Knighthood
- 12. Constitutional Revisions

Article VI Amendments

Section 1:

The procedure of amending this Constitution is as follows:

(a): It shall be the responsibility of any Florida DeMolay proposing an amendment to this Constitution to provide for the distribution of said proposal to the Constitutional Revisions Committee, Jurisprudence Committee, Elective State Officers, Executive Officer, Board of Administration, and member Chapters of this Association not less than 60 days prior to the opening session of Conclave.

(b): The proposed amendment, after the approval of the Jurisprudence Committee, and the Board of Administration, shall be presented for consideration on the floor of Conclave. Upon the approval of two-thirds (2/3) of the delegates present and voting, it shall

take effect upon the close of the Annual Conclave.

Chapter 1 Revenue

Section 1.01: Each chapter shall pay as dues the sum of fifteen (\$15.00) dollars for each initiate to the Florida State DeMolay Association, Inc., and shall be payable with the Form 10 reporting the initiation.

Section 1.015: The revenue derived from the initiation fee in Section 1.01 shall be distributed as follows; 33 1/3% General Account, 33 1/3% Savings Account, 33 1/3% as provided in Chapter 4, Section 4.04.

Chapter 2 State Conclave

Section 2.01: There shall be Ritual Competition, Athletic Competition, State Sweetheart Competition, Election of State Officers and any other business for the Good of the Order of this Association.

Section 2.02: There shall be Ritual Competition conducted under the direction of the Executive Officer's Personal Representative for Ritual, assisted by the Chairman of the State Ritual Committee. This competition shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the Old South Tournament.

There shall be Athletic Competition conducted under the direction of the State Director of Athletics assisted by the State Athletics Committee. The State Director of Athletics, appointed by the Executive Officer, shall appoint for each competition referees for each event who shall use the playing rules established by the Florida State High School Association.

There shall be State Sweetheart Competition. The rules and regulations as determined by the Executive Officer shall be published in the proceedings

of the year's Conclave.

For the purposes of participation in the activities and/or competitions sanctioned by this Association, any person who has not yet reached the age of 21 years before the opening of Conclave shall be entitled to participate as an active DeMolay, and at any subsequent level of competition; provided that they have not been certified as an Advisor.

Section 2.06:

There shall be a Mini-Conclave, to be held annually in or about the month of January at a specific time and place to be determined by the Executive Officer and Master Councilor. The Mini-Conclave shall consist of:

Such meetings of the State Officers as are deemed necessary by the State Master Councilor.

All State Committees shall be required to meet and report to th b. State Master Councilor.

Any other Ritual and/or Athletic competitions and social C. activities which are deemed necessary and appropriate.

The installation of the State Scribe/Treasurer. d.

Section 3.01:

Any qualified DeMolay who desires to run for an elective office of this Association shall send a letter of intent to the Executive Officer and Chairmen of the Nominations Committee, prior to the opening Delegate Session of Conclave. The Letter of Intent will be read aloud before the DeMolay Delegation by the Nominations Committee Chairman prior to elections.

Section 3.02:

All candidates must be residents of the State of Florida for at least six months prior to the election and shall be members in good standing of a member Chapter of this Association. All candidates for elective State Office must possess at the time of filing of their Letter of Intent, proof of being a Representative DeMolay, Past Master Councilor and a graduate of the Leadership Correspondence Course, copies of such proof shall accompany said letter. Only those Brothers who submit a letter of intent for the Office of State Parliamentarian shall be eligible to run for said office. All candidates for the Office of State Parliamentarian shall have read, and be familiar with, Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 3.30:

All candidates for the Office of State Master Councilor must be at least 17 years of age and have been a member of this order for at least two (2) years prior to June 1 of the year of his election.

Section 3.04:

A candidate shall not cause any distribution of materials written or oral pertaining to his candidacy before he has submitted his Letter of Intent to the proper persons (as stated in Chapter 3, Section 3.01). The date of submission shall be determined by the Letter of Intent's postmark. He will be authorized to distribute calling cards only. This card will be no larger than the standard DeMolay Dues Card in overall size, and will contain no information other that the name, address, phone number, emblem of the Order of DeMolay, titles and/or honors and the title of the office being sought by the candidate. This card will be the only authorized material which may be distributed in his behalf at Conclave or at any time.

Section 3.05:

The election of officers of this Association shall take place at the discretion of the State Master Councilor during a regular business session at each Annual State Conclave.

Section 3.06:

No more than two (2) Elected State Officers shall be from the same member Chapter of this Association.

Section 3.07:

The Election of Officers shall be in order of rank, the highest being first, the order as provided by this Constitution, by secret ballot of those entitled to vote, as otherwise provided in the Constitution, at each Annual Conclave of this Association. A majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary for a candidate to be elected.

Section 3.08:

Section 3.08: Any qualified candidate who is not elected to the office for which he has submitted a Letter of Intent may be nominated for a lower office from the floor during Elections, subject to the restrictions of Chapter 3, Section

3.02.

Section 3.09:

The ballots for the Election of Officers shall be prepared by the State Scribe/Treasurer for each Annual Conclave. The ballots shall be distributed to each delegate entitled to vote, prior to the opening of elections, and the ballots shall be cast with the full name of the candidate for the particular office legibly written thereon; ballots shall be folded only once. Blank ballots, illegible ballots and those otherwise deviating from the proper form provided herein shall be tabulated as abstentions.

Section 3.10(a):

Each member Chapter shall be entitled to be represented by three (3) delegates at the Annual Conclave. Each delegate shall have one vote in all matters brought on the floor of the Conclave, providing he has been certified by his Chapter Advisor and has been registered with the Credentials Committee prior to the opening session of Conclave. in the event that less than three (3) delegates from a Chapter are in attendance at Conclave, any or all of the absent delegate votes may be given to a remaining Delegate from that Chapter. In order to accomplish this, the Chapter Advisor must submit written authorization to the Credentials Committee before the opening business session of Conclave. Section 3.10(b):

All of a Chapter's delegates must be members of said Chapter.

Section 3.11(a):

Every Past State Master Councilor who has not reached the age of twenty-one (21) years and is properly registered will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave.

Section 3.11(b):

The State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Parliamentarian, and the State Scribe/Treasurer will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave.

Each Chapter Delegation shall elect a Delegation Chairman during all business sessions, the vote of the delegation shall be announced by the Chairman of the Delegation with the exception of secret ballot for State Officer Elections.

Chapter 4 Duties of State Officers

The State Master Councilor shall be the duly elected head of this Association, and it shall be his duty to perform all duties which naturally pertain to such an office or which may devolve upon him from time to time.

The State Master Councilor shall preside at the Annual Conclave and work in conjunction with the Board of Administration. He shall also work with the Executive Officer and his Staff in making arrangements of said Conclave.

Section 4.03:

The State Master Councilor shall appoint all committee chairmen of this Association, and in consultation with each chairman, appoint the committee members.

Section 4.04:

The State Master Councilor shall have an expense account equal to 33 1/3% of the amount collected for each initiate reported to Florida State DeMolar Association, Inc. on a Form 10 which shall be used for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of his and other State Officers duties, with the State Master Councilor's approval.

Section 4.05:

The State Master Councilor shall in person, or by personal Representative, visit each chapter in this state at least once during his term of office so far as is applicable.

Section 4.06:

The State Master Councilor shall report in writing to the Association at each Annual Conclave, all of his official acts, whether performed in person or by Personal Representative.

Section 4.07:

The Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Parliamentarian, and State Scribe/Treasurer shall represent the State Master Councilor when so ordered, assist the State Master Councilor in every way possible in the discharge of his duties, and shall report to this association in writing at each Annual Conclave, all of their official acts.

Section 4.08:

The State Scribe/Treasurer's records shall be subject to an audit conducted by the Executive Officer.

Section 4.09(a):

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall record the minutes of the Annual Conclave of this Association and any official state meeting. He shall then within sixty (60) days have aforesaid minutes, together with the Constitution and Statutes of their latest revision, published with the rules and regulations of the Sweepstakes Competition, and distributed as follows:

One copy to each member Chapter of this Association.

2. Copies to the Executive Officer, one copy to each member of the Supreme Council residing in the state, and one copy to any advisor appointed by the Executive Officer in a supervisory capacity, including the Board of Administration.

3. One copy to the State Master Councilor, Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, and

State Parliamentarian.

4. One copy to the International Supreme Council.

5. One copy to each of the State Committee Chairmen.

6. One copy to each jurisdiction in Region 3 of the International Supreme Council, sent to the Executive Officer.

Section 4.09(b):

The State Scribe/Treasurer, with the approval of the State Scribe/Treasurer Advisor, shall have authority to correct any grammatical and typographical errors as he deems necessary and appropriate.

Section 4.09(c):

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall work with an Advisor who is satisfactory to the Board of Administration. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall obtain three (3) or more bids for the cost of printing the Conclave Proceedings before the registration of said Conclave. Section 4.10:

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall, under the direction of the State Master Councilor, and/or the Association, conduct all correspondence of this Association.

Section 4.11:

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall keep and maintain a true copy of the Constitution and Statutes of the Florida DeMolay Association. He shall also supply a copy for the Board of Administration, and for the Executive Officer of Florida.

Section 4.12:

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall make disbursement for this Association with the approval of the Executive Officer. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall make an itemized report of all transactions in connection with his office at the Annual Conclave.

Section 4.13:

The State Parliamentarian shall decide the constitutionality of all motions, resolutions, and proposals presented by the standing committees, or from the floor of Conclave, when so requested by the State Master Councilor.

Chapter 5 Committees

Section 5.01:

All committees shall be responsible for reporting on the fiscal and physical feasibility of their proposals.

Section 5.02:

The duties of the Jurisprudence Committee shall be to determine the constitutionality of all motions, resolutions, and proposals presented by the standing committees or from the floor of Conclave. The State Parliamentarian shall act as Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee.

Section 5.03:

The duties of the Nominations Committee shall be;

(a) to receive and review letters of intent filed by person(s) seeking qualification as (a) candidate(s) for Elective State Office; upon completion of the review the Chairman shall notify the prospective candidate of approval or shall notify him of deficiencies therein; such review and notification shall be completed within twenty (20) days after receipt of the letter by the Chairman; a candidate may submit an amended Letter of Intent which shall also be reviewed as specified herein above.

Section 5.04:

The Membership Committee shall study and promote an active program for acquisition of eligible youth in this Jurisdiction.

Section 5.05:

The duties of the Credentials Committee shall be to validate the credentials of all Delegates to Conclave in accordance with Chapter 3, Sections 3.11 and 3.12 of the Statutes. This committee shall be responsible for arranging the seating of said delegates.

Section 5.06:

The duty of the Public Relations and Publications Committee shall be to promote the image of DeMolay through programs of public interest and to put the name of DeMolay before the general public. It shall also be the duty of this committee to inform and assist member Chapters in the Annual DeMolay Week program. This committee shall oversee any publication of this Association and any related programs.

Section 5.07:

The State Ritual Committee shall promote uniformity in the ritual of the Order of DeMolay throughout this Association, and shall recommend to the Association for approval, procedures for the performance of ritualistic matters not specifically set forth in the Ritual of Secret Work of the Order of DeMolay and methods of receiving introducing, and accommodating those who are entitled to recognition in all Conclaves, meetings, and public ceremonies of the Association. It shall also develop review and revise any state ceremonies which may be used by this Association.

Section 5.08:

The Athletics Committee shall work with the State Sports Director in acquiring qualified, unbiased judging officials for all State Athletics Competitions. They are also to make certain that no Advisors shall judge their own Chapters. They shall also review and submit any proposals to the State Master Councilor.

Section 5.09:

The duty of the Constitutional Revisions Committee shall be to recommend pertinent and necessary revisions to the Constitution and Statutes.

The Knighthood Committee shall report to the Delegates on the activities of the State Priory.

Section 5.11:

The Budget and Finance Committee shall review the financial status of this

Association and report the same to the delegates of the Annual Conclave. Any proposals, including committee recommendations, containing fiscal impact shall be submitted to this committee for its review and It shall also be the committee's responsibility to put recommendation. together the Conclave Program and such advertisements necessary for its production. This committee shall also present a proposed comprehensive budget for this Association to the delegates and, upon approval, present the proposed budget to the Executive Officer. The expenditures of this Association shall not exceed its income from Conclave to Conclave.

Section 5.12:

The Guidance Committee shall be the duly appointed State Master Councilor's Representatives of the several Zones. This Committee will function at the will of the State Master Councilor. It shall act in an advisory capacity to relay to the State Master Councilor the suggested needs of the

individual Zones and the State as a whole. This committee shall physically meet at least twice before the opening session of the Annual Conclave.

Section 5.13:

The Executive Committee shall be composed of the chairmen of all the committees, the Elected State Officers, State Scribe/Treasurer, and all Past State Master Councilors who have not reached their majority. It shall be chaired by the State Master Councilor, and shall meet at his discretion.

Section 5.14:

The State Master Councilor shall announce the names of the appointed Committee Chairmen, Appointed State Officers, and State Master Councilor's Representatives at the last business session of the State Conclave. The names of the Chairmen shall be published, with the exception of the State Credentials Committee Chairman in the current proceedings of this Association.

Section 5.15:

The State Master Councilor shall have the authority to appoint one Advisor to each committee with the consultation of the committee chairman and the director, if one has been appointed.

Section 5.16:

It shall be the duty of each committee to submit to the State Master Councilor a report upon request. It shall also be the duty of each State Committee Chairman to gather suggestions and recommendations from the member Chapters and combine them with his own ideas and submit them to the State Master Councilor as a tentative agenda thirty (30) days prior to Conclave.

Section 5.17:

The final committee reports shall be typewritten and submitted to the State Scribe/Treasurer no later than the beginning of the last business session at each Conclave.

Section 5.18:

A final report from each State Committee must be read and passed by a simple majority vote of the Delegates prior to the close of Conclave.

Section 5.19:

The State Master Councilor shall have the power to establish and abolish additional committees (with the exception of standing committees) as he deem necessary.

Each individual state committee shall be responsible for implementing the recommendations made by that committee and approved by the delegates at the most recently conducted Conclave. The Executive Committee shall oversee and coordinate this implementation.

Section 5.21:

All committees shall physically meet at least three (3) times a year prior to the Opening Session of Conclave and submit minutes of these meetings to the State Master Councilor at the Annual Conclave.

Chapter 6 State Master Councilor's Representatives

Section 6.01:

It will be the duty of each State Master Councilor's Representative to promote Florida DeMolay and its communications to the members of this Association.

Section 6.02:

It will be the duty of each State Master Councilor's Representative to provide monthly reports to the State Master Councilor, Guidance Committee Chairman, and State Officer in charge of his Zone, concerning the progress, activities, and needs of his Chapter and Zone.

Section 6.03:

The State Master Councilor's Representatives will be required to attend all meetings of the Guidance Committee of this Association.

Section 6.04:

The State Master Councilor's Representatives shall act as Personal Representative of the State Master Councilor to serve on his behalf when no other ranking State Officer is present. Section 6.05:

Each Zone will have one (1) State Master Councilor's Representative for every three chapters or fraction thereof. The State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor to serve at his will.

Section 6.06:

State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be obligated to attend both Mini-Conclave and Conclave.

Section 6.07:

All State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be required to begin working on their L.C.C. and R.D. within 30 days after their appointment, if they have not previously completed them. Proof of which, must be furnished by his Chapter Advisor.

Chapter 7 State Appointed Officers

Section 7.01:

State Appointed Officers of this Association shall include; the State Senior Deacon, State Junior Deacon, State Senior Steward, State Junior Steward, State Orator, State Sentinel, State Chaplain, State Marshall, State Standard Bearer, State Almoner, and the Seven State Preceptors.

Section 7.02:

It shall be the duty of each State Appointed Officer to promote the Florida DeMolay Association and its communications to the members of this association.

Section 7.03: It shall be said Officers duty to provide monthly reports to the State Master Councilor concerning the progress, activities and needs of their Chapter and Zone.

Section 7.04: Said Officers will be required to attend all meetings of the Public Relations and Publications Committee.

Section 7.05:

Said Officers shall act a Personal Representatives of the State Master Councilor when no other ranking officer is present.

Section 7.06:

Said Officers will be required t memorize their portions of the Ritual Ceremonies.

Section 7.07:

Said Officers shall be required to begin working on their L.C.C. and R.D., within thirty days after their appointment, if they have not previously completed them.

Section 7.08:

Said Officers shall be obligated to attend both Conclave and Mini-Conclave.

Chapter 8 Amendments

Section 8.01:

These Statutes can be amended by a simple majority vote of the delegation, and such amendments may be substituted any time prior to the first Business Session of Conclave, and need only be submitted to the Delegates of the Chapters in attendance at the Conclave.

Section 8.02:

These amendments shall, upon the approval of the Board of Administration and the delegation, take effect immediately.
