

Dad Hunt, Distinguished East, my Fellow State Officers, and Brother DeMolays: It is now my duty to deliver the State of the Order address, To express my views on the high and low points of the last year and to evaluate the progress made in that time.

At the beginning of my term Florida DeMolay was faced with the problems of apathy and steadily declining membership. These problems received first priority this year. Even with the combined efforts of the State officers, Staff, DeMolays and Advisors, membership continued to decline.

Throughout the year I sought to unify all DeMolays in Florida into a single cohesive unit instead of factions, knowing that, in the words of Abraham Lincoln, "A house divided against itself cannot stand." Florida DeMolay will grow and prosper

only in the spirit of harmony and cooperation.

This year DeMolays in Florida were urged to continue the DeMolay spirit of DeMolay's foundations excellence. Dedicated leadership and service in

academics, religion and civic service were urged and stressed to all.

The key to this was to instill a sense of enthusiasm in all DeMolays. Without this key element of enthusiasm, all the knowledge, leadership, and service would have been useless. Without the spark of enthusiasm to be the catalyst to make DeMolay in Florida explode and grow, there would be no growth.

Adapting a line from the Installation of Officers Ceremony, "The common burden can be born by neither officers, members, or advisors alone. The most efficient officers who could be chosen would be ineffective without the loyal help of the members and the guidance of advisors, and the most enthusiastic members would be powerless without intelligent leadership. Without this faithful and efficient cooperation you cannot hope for nor would you deserve success." This needs no explanation. It stands on its own as Florida DeMolay's ingredients for success.

With this in mind I welcome you all to the Hilton, Altamonte Springs and urge you to attend and participate in as many activities as possible. By the power in me vested as State Master Councilor of the Florida DeMolay Association, I now declare

this 56th Annual Conclave open.

MINUTES OF THE 56th ANNUAL SESSION TUESDAY, AUGUST 1, 1989

The regular business session of the 56th Annual Conclave of the Florida DeMolay Association was called to order at 8:15 A.M. by Brother J. Wesley Hyde, State Master Councilor.

Brother Hyde then turned the Chair over to Brother Al Webb, Credentials Committee Chairman. Brother Webb then took Roll Call and Delegate Count was taken. The delegate count was:

Total Delegate Count: 55
Simple Majority: 28
Two-Thirds Majority: 38

Brother Hyde then turned the Chair over to Brother Brett Gordon, Ritual Committee Chairman, who read the following report.

STATE RITUAL COMMITTEE

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the State Ritual Committee, have met and discussed the performance of last year's committee. These are the recommendations and results of those recommendations over the course of the year.

- A) For the past two years this committee has recommended that at least one Advisor and DeMolay attend the Competitive Degree Judges course. In this past year, few if any have taken this advice.
- B) Last year's Committee recommended that this Association should implement the T.O.C. Ritual Certificate program. It was implemented but only a few DeMolays took advantage of it.
- C) Last year's Committee recommended that facilities for ritual competition should contain adequate space for all persons involved. Since we have all the meeting rooms at this hotel reserved, there should be no space problems.

These are the new recommendations to be brought before you for your approval.

1) To promote better ritual DeMolays need to compete at younger ages. This committee feels that all individual competitions, such as the Flower Talk and Ceremony of Light, should be divided into two categories---- Junior and Senior. The Senior category would be from 16 to 21 years of age and the Junior category would consist of the 13 to 15 year olds. This would enable those younger DeMolays to compete on an equal level and not against older more competent speakers.

- 2) To promote the T.O.C. Ritual Certificate program Zone Directors should hold competitions at their Zone meetings. There should also be competitions such as these at Conclave and Mini-Conclave. To make this program work we need to advertise it to the DeMolays. This will be done by the next Ritual Committee Chairman, State line and appointed officers. S.M.C.R.'s could also be used to their full extent in this program.
- 3) To promote the C.D.J. program, the Director of T.O.C., or one of his representatives, should attend at least one Zone meeting per zone and put on the course. It is obvious to this Committee that the DeMolays and Advisors are not taking it upon themselves to participate in this much needed program.
- To promote overall ritual this Committee feels that Zone Teams are going to help those chapters that want to compete but are unable because of their size. Next year's Committee should evaluate the success of this Conclave's Zone Team Competitions and promote more during the upcoming year.

This Committee feels that all recommendations from Ritual Committees in the past have been worthwhile, but these recommendations need to be publicized for them to work.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes of the Florida DeMolay Association, this report is fiscally and physically feasible.

Brother Joe Larson, Seminole Chapter, objected to recommendation number 1. Brother John Thompson, Sons of Liberty Chapter, moved to accept all unobjected portions of the report. The motion was Seconded and Passed by the delegation.

After a brief discussion Brother Larson removed his objection to recommendation number 1 and the recommendation was upon Motion made and Seconded then Approved by the Delegation.

Brother Wes Hyde then read the Executive Committee Report.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the 1988-89 Executive Committee would like to first report on the recommendations made by last year's Committee.

A. Suggestion 1 of last year's report advised that dates for the Fall Area Meetings be set before the last day of Conclave, and the date for the Spring Area Meetings be set before the end of Mini-Conclave. The Committee also suggested that the Area Meetings be located in an area conducive to work and that a fun activity be held the same weekend.

This Committee found that most Zone Directors did plan their Area Meetings as suggested. However, some could not, or did not, do so. All of the meetings were held at a Lodge or camp with adequate facilities for meetings. Some of the Area Meetings were held over the entire weekend and did have a fun type of activity following it but several did not.

B. Suggestion 2 of last year's report dealt with State Committee Chairmen working with an Advisor or the State Staff member corresponding to the committee who would be announced at the Installation of Officers at Conclave.

This suggestion was partially implemented. Several committees did have State Staff members working with them as Advisors and the other chairmen did have Advisors to work with, however, none of the Advisors were announced at the Installation of Officers.

C. Suggestion 3 of last year's report urged all the DeMolays of Florida to attend the annual Region 3 Grand Master's Class in Ft. Walton Beach. It was also urged that Florida Knighthood continue to sponsor this event.

Florida Knighthood did, as suggested, sponsor the Grand Master's Class. Attendance at this event was poor, by Florida standards. Fewer than 30 DeMolays from Florida attended this event.

D. Suggestion 5 of last year's report advised that copies of all of the committee reports be distributed to the state staff at the Conclave Review Session.

This suggestion was implemented as much as possible. Several, but not all reports were available to be distributed at the review session.

E. Suggestion 6 of last year's report urged that a financial annual report be included in each year's Conclave Proceedings. It was also suggested that income as well as expenditures be reported.

The report provided in the Conclave Proceedings was not an annual report, but was rather a general outline of expenses

without indication of the sources of revenue. A short profit/loss statement was also included.

This year's Committee would like to make the following recommendations:

- 1. Fall and Spring Area Meetings should definitely be planned by the end of Conclave and Mini-Conclave respectively. In addition to this, the member Chapters of the Zone(s) attending the meeting should be notified well over a month in advance as to the time and place to insure increased attendance and participation. We recommend that the State Master Councilor advise the Zone Directors of the time that the State Officers will need to use at the Area Meetings for the presentation of any information, programs or discussion so that proper arrangements can be made. This Committee is greatly concerned with many Chapters and even entire Zones having no members at the Area Meetings both in the Fall and Spring and with certain Chapters either receiving last minute or no notice at all of the meetings.
- 2. Each Chapter try to have representation at the Region 3 Grand Master's Class. The Grand Master's Class is quickly taking the form of a Regional Conclave, complete with ritual and athletic competitions, dances, the opportunity to meet our brothers from the other states in Region 3 (Georgia, Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee, North Carolina and South Carolina), and the chance as well as to solve common problems such as poor communication and shrinking membership.
- 3. A complete financial report be published by the Florida State DeMolay Association, Inc. This will include expenses as had been reported as well as revenue from the following: donations, petition fees, per capita tax, interest, income from conclaves, convocation, and other meetings, and other income.
- Information of the Leadership Training Conference be distributed as soon as it is available. This Committee urges all DeMolays to attend LTC. It is an incredible This year, due to a learning experience for all DeMolays. lack of communication and information about LTC, Florida lost the chance to host an LTC because of the lack of DeMolays registered. The 50 DeMolays necessary were not attained. This resulted in Florida DeMolays having to travel either to Arkansas or Virginia to attend. With the loss of our LTC came the loss of several thousand dollars in potential LTC scholarships from the High-12 organization. Over half of the money originally offered for LTC scholarships by High-12 was able to be used for Conclave scholarships instead. With proper communication of information, Florida will be able to host successful LTCs in the future.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes, this report will have no fiscal or physical impact.

Brother Shannon Locklear, American Crusaders Chapter, objected to recommendation C and 4. Brother Joe Larson, Seminole Chapter, objected to recommendation 2. Brother Tom McDuffy, Sons of Liberty Chapter, moved to accept all unobjected portions of the report. The motion was Seconded and Passed by the Delegation.

Brother Hyde called on Brother Locklear, who withdrew his objection to recommendation C and 4, which then upon Motion and Second were Approved by the Delegates. After a brief discussion of recommendation 2, the Question was called and upon the taking of the vote, it failed.

Brother Hyde then called on Brother Al Webb, Chairman of the Credentials Committee who read the following report:

CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE REPORT

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

The Credentials Committee has met and the credentials of all Delegates have been validated in accordance with Section 5.05 of the Statutes.

This year at the 56th Annual Conclave for the Jurisdiction of Florida, there are 31 chapters and 1 Past State Master Councilor registered for a total of 90 Delegate votes. Assuming that all Delegates are present at a session, a majority vote would be 46 and a two-thirds majority vote would be 60. A quorum to conduct a session is 46.

Once again, this Committee would like to remind all Advisors that in accordance with Section 3.11 of the Statutes "In the event that less than three (3) Delegates from a Chapter are in attendance at Conclave, any or all of the absent delgate votes may be given to a remaining Delegate from that Chapter. In order to acomplish this, the Chapter Advisor must submit written authorization to the Credentials Committee prior to the opening business session of Conclave." Unless this is done each Delegate is allowed only one (1) vote.

This Committee would also like to recommend that Delegate registration be reinstated on the Conclave Registration Form, as

this allows for an easier compilation of figures and allows for tangible evidence of Delegate certification.

This Committee would also like to recommend the continuation of the Delegate list included in this report, since this addition allows for a chance to follow the work of upcoming leaders within our state, while giving credit to those truly involved in state policies.

This Committee would also like to thank the B.O.A. for their help in many of the recommendations in this report. This report will have no physical or fiscal impact, pursuant to Section 5.01.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual DeMolay Conclave.

We the members of the Membership Committee have met, and have this report to submit to you for your approval.

- A. Pursuant to last years report, we have the following statements to make.
- 1. The suggestion in last years report that RD and LCC programs be pushed is a good idea, however, it is not the job of our committee. We feel it is the job of the Guidance Committee.
- We feel that the continuation of a Task Force is an excellent idea because the goals were realistic and it should be continued.
- 3. Section 1 of the recommendations which says the Membership Committee Chairman should send Chapters a report on their progress in their membership quota, which has been copied for the past few years, has yet to be implemented, so we feel it should be discontinued.
- 4. Section 2, which says the SMC should send a Chapter a letter of congratulations for membership excellence has not been implemented by the SMC. We feel strongly that the next SMC should send the letters.
- 5. Section 3, saying that each zone have a quarterly meeting is a good idea, but is not good enough. We feel there should additionally be monthly Zone Meetings to conduct business, and that those meetings should include Jobs Daughters and Rainbow Girls so as to plan group activities.
- 6. Section 4, which says the Chapters should aid the Chairman by sending him reports on their Chapters is a good idea, but was not implemented. We feel the Chapters should send reports.

7. Section 5, which says the State Officers should push the SMC program is a good idea; however, we feel the SMC should be able to present a copy of his program to them at the time of their election or appointment. 8. Section 6, which says that Chapters with less than eight (8) active members should continue to meet is a good idea; however, we feel that they should continue to meet and be aided at each meeting by a committee member or a State Officer to help them get on their feet. We feel that every young man deserves DeMolay, so we have the following recommendations to make in order to make DeMolay grow to a new high: We feel that the Membership Committee should consist of a DeMolay from each Zone and at least two (2) committee Advisors to ensure statewide communications. The Chairman should make recommendations for committee members and then give them to the SMC for final approval before the end of Conclave. We feel that the Committee should meet at least once between Conclave and Mini-Conclave and at least once between The Chairman should keep in close Mini-Conclave and Conclave. contact with the SMC and his committee at least once a month by mail or phone. The committee meetings for our committee should not be It is a proven fact this this set up during competitions. causes low attendance, which makes the meetings unsuccessful. Besides, the Chapter is the #1 goal of our Committee. The Chairman and the SMC should be in close contact with each other, especially with our membership problem in this state. We feel the SMC should obtain the following items to aid the Chairman in accomplishing the grueling task of boosting our state membership: a copy of the progress of all chapters progress a) a current Masonic directory b) mailing addresses of all chapters C) a State Officer directory FSDA directory of staff e) a copy of the SMC membership program f) a copy of the IMC membership program We feel the Chairman should be responsible for writing a membership editorial in the state newspaper. 6. We suggest that a membership Task Force be set up at Conclave by the Membership Committee, the EO, and all state officers wishing to help. The possibility of unrealistic goals will not occur if the Zone Director tells us the progress of the Chapters in his Zone. -17-

- 7. We suggest that each Zone have an Area Conclave consisting of competitions and social events, with a time set aside for a membership presentation by the Membership Committee to help boost DeMolay membership.
- C. We would like to say that the Membership Committee is there to help you with your membership problems and will aid you in any way possible.

The Chair then called on Brother Will Fleming, Guidance Committee Chairman, who read the following report:

STATE GUIDANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

This Committee would like to report on the implementation and effectiveness of the 1987-1988 State Guidance Committee Report.

A) Last year's recommendations for SMCR's to wear name badges instead of collars was implemented and found to be less successful than collars.

- B) Last year's recommendations requiring SMCR's to make a deposit upon receipt of badges was found to be very effective in continued.
- C) The recommendation that SMCR's be properly attired was found to be very successful where enforced. It is the feeling of this Committee that this should continue in the future.
- D) The recommendation that the 1988-1989 State Guidance Committee find a resolution to the decreasing number of RD and LCC's was implemented. The number of RD and LCC's has risen significantly above last year's totals in the last month due to increased publicity solicited by the SMCR's.
- E) Last year's recommendations that the SMCR's should travel outside of their own Zone was not opted by the State Master Councilor, but we feel this should be implented.
- F) Last year's recommendation that the name, address and telephone number of the SMCR's be included in the proceedings was implemented and should continue.

The following are the recommendations, observations and reports of the 1988-1989 State Guidance Committee.

1) This committee would like to recommend that SMCR badges be replaced with collars. The plate of the collar will read as follows:

SMCR

The cost would not exceed \$11.00 each. This cost would be appropriated from the Florida State DeMolay Association, Inc. account.

- 2) To ensure safe return of the collars the following year, this Committee recommends that a \$20.00 deposit be made by the SMCR's at Conclave upon receipt of the collar and that the deposit be collected by the State Master Councilor. This deposit would be refunded upon return of the collar.
- 3) This Committee recommends that the SMCRs visit at least one Chapter per month, other than their own, and submit a Chapter Visitation Report, reflecting their visit, to the Zone Director and to the State Officer in charge of their Zone.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes, this report has a fiscal impact, as indicated in recommendation numbers 1 and 2. This report has no physical impact.

Chapter 2

Section 2.05

For the purposes of participation in the activities and/or competitions sanctioned by this Association, any person who has not yet reached the age of 21 years before June 1 of the year of the Conclave shall be entitled to participate as an active DeMolay, and at any subsequent level of competition; provided that they shall not have been certified as an advisor.

PROPOSAL--CHANGE: 'shall not have' to 'have not'

For the purposes of participation in the activities and/or competitions sanctioned by this Association, any person who has not yet reached the age of 21 years before June 1 of the year of the Conclave shall be entitled to participate as an active DeMolay, and at any subsequent level of competition; provided that they have not been certified as an advisor. PROPOSAL APPROVED.

Section 2.06:

There shall be a Mini-Conclave, to be held annually in or about the month of January at a specific time and place to be determined by the Executive Officer and the State Master Councilor. The Mini-Conclave shall consist of:

- Such meetings of the State Officers as are deemed necessary by the State Master Councilor.
- All State Committees shall be required to meet and report to the State Master Councilor, and
- Any other Ritual and/or Athletic competitions and social activities which are deemed necessary and appropriate.

PROPOSAL----ADD: d) The Installation of the State Scribe/Treasurer

There shall be a Mini-Conclave, to be held annually in or about the month of January at a specific time and place to be determined by the Executive Officer and the State Master Councilor. The Mini-Conclave shall consist of:

- Such meetings of the State Officers as are deemed necessary by the State Master Councilor.
- All State Committees shall be required to meet and report to b) the State Master Councilor,
- Any other Ritual and/or Atheletic competitions and social activities which are deemed necessary and appropriate.
- The Installation of the State Scribe/Treasurer.

PROPOSAL APPROVED.

Chapter 3

PROPOSAL --- ADD: New Section 3.01(b)

After the report of the Nominations Committee is read, any qualified DeMolay may be nominated from the floor provided he submits a letter of his qualifications to the Executive Officer and the Nominations Committee Chairman prior to the election. This letter of qualification shall serve as his letter of intent. PROPOSAL DEFEATED.

Section 3.04:

A candidate shall not cause any distribution of materials written or oral pertaining to his candidacy before he has submitted his letter of intention to the proper person (as stated in Chapter 3.01). The date of submission shall be determined by the letter of intent's postmark. He will be authorized to distribute calling cards only. This card will be no larger than the standard DeMolay dues card in overall size, and will contain no information other than the name, address, phone number, titles and/or honors and the title of the office being sought by the candidate. This card will be the only authorized material which may be distributed in his behalf at Conclave or any other time.

PROPOSAL---DELETE: "The date of submission shall be determined by the letter of intent's postmark."

A candidate shall not cause any distribution of materials written or oral pertaining to his candidacy before he has submitted his letter of intention to the proper persons (as stated in Chapter 3, Section 3.01). He will be authorized to distribute calling cards only. This card will be no larger than the standard DeMolay dues card in overall size, and will contain no information other than the name, address, phone number, titles and/or honors and the title of the office being sought by the candidate. This card will be the only authorized material which may be distributed in his behalf at Conclave or at any time. PROPOSAL DEFEATED

Section 3.07

It being the purpose of the Order of DeMolay to develop leadership and a sense of responsibility among individual members of the Order, Elected State Officers or State Scribe/Treasurer of this Association shall not succeed themselves or ever hold a lower ranking office with the exception of a Committee Chairmanship.

PROPOSAL: DELETE ENTIRE SECTION PROPOSAL DEFEATED

Section 3.09

Any qualified candidate who is not elected to the office for which he has submitted a letter of intent may be nominated for a lower office from the floor during elections, subject to the restrictions of Chapter 3, Section 3.02 and 3.07.

PROPOSAL: DELETE: the words "and 3.07"

Any qualified candidate who is not elected to the office for which he has submitted a letter of intent may be nominated for a lower office from the floor during elections, subject to the restrictions of Chapter 3, Section 3.02.

PROPOSAL DEFEATED

PROPOSAL----ADD New Section 3.11(b):

All of a Chapter's delegates must be members of said

Chapter.

PROPOSAL APPROVED.

PROPOSAL----ADD New Section 3.12(b):

No Past State Master Councilor shall be entitled to claim a Chapter's absent delegate votes. To the foregoing there was added from the Floor, at the end of the sentence, the language "..., unless he is registered with said Chapter.

PROPOSAL, AS ADDED TO, APPROVED. Not Approved By B.O.A.

Chapter 4

PROPOSAL----ADD NEW SECTION 4.09(c):

The State Scribe/Treasurer shall work with an Advisor who is satisfactory to the Board of Administration. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall obtain three (3) or more bids for the cost of printing the Conclave Proceedings before the registration of said Conclave.

PROPOSAL APPROVED

Chapter 5

Section 5.03

The duties of the Nominations Committee shall be:

a. The duty of the Credentials Committee shall be to validate the credentials of all delegates to Conclave in accordance with Chapter 3, Sections 3.11 and 3.12 of the Statutes. This committee shall be responsible for arranging the seating of said delegates.

PROPOSAL APPROVED.

Chapter 8

Section 8.02

These amendments shall, upon the approval of the Board of Administration and the delegation, take effect upon the close of the Annual Conclave.

PROPOSAL---CHANGE: "upon the close of the Annual Conclave" to "immediately"

These amendments shall, upon the approval of the Board of Administration and the delegation, take effect immediately. PROPOSAL APPROVED.

Please pay close attention to the revisions we are proposing, and try to understand the reasons for these changes. Again, we hope they meet with your approval. This Committee would like to recommend that anyone wanting to propose revisions in the future, submit them to the Constitutional Revisions Committee Chairman well before the opening session of Conclave, so that he may include them in his report.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PUBLICATIONS REPORT

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the Public Relations and Publications Committee have met and would like to submit this report for your approval:

With regard to last year's recommendations:

Last year's recommendation that the Committee's name be changed to the Public Relations and Communications Committee was not implemented because at the time this recommendation was made we did not have a state newspaper, and now that we have, the Committee feels that the current name is much more appropriate.

Concerning having at least six members plus the Chairman on this committee and having them spread across the state: we found that having contacts across the state was beneficial, and we believe that it should be continued in the future.

With regard to this Committee's Chairman maintaining contact with the Zone Directors to increase communication throughout the State, the State Master Councilor specified that he wanted the S.M.R.C.'s to handle this as this is a major part of their job.

During the course of this year a new State Newspaper has appeared. It has grown more popular over the months. This Committee feels that with the growth of the newspaper, the level of communication has increased throughout the state and should most definitely be continued.

The Members of this Committee would like to make the following recommendations for the coming year:

- a) We recommend that Dad and Mom Jenkins be recognized for their outstanding work with the Florida State Newspaper, and this recognition be in the form of a Certificate Of Appreciation from the Florida State DeMolay Association.
- b) We recommend that Demolays be encouraged to voice more of their enthusiasm for DeMolay, their Advisors, along with Zone and Chapter programs within the State Newspaper. This could only help to build morale within DeMolay as a whole.
- c) We recommend that DeMolays take a greater part in attendance at the Grand Master's Class, as this is an excellent public relations opportunity. Also, we would like to see a greater use of the State Newspaper to advertise this affair and report the events of this class.
- d) This Committee further recommends that the guideline in the Florida State S.O.P. concerning the mailing of certifications of elections be more strictly enforced by the Zone directors, as this is where our mailing list for the State Newspaper comes from.
- e) We recommend that Chapters make a greater use of local radio and newspapers, utilizing the public relations materials available through the International Supreme Council. Also, an article should be written by the Chairman of this committee, describing how these materials may be obtained, and how they can be used to their maximum potential.
- f) We recommend that the Membership Chairman write periodic bulletins on our current membership progress. He should also write special bulletins concerning those Chapters which are leading the state in membership, and any state goals which are achieved.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

We, the members of the 1988-89 Budget and Finance Committee would first like to report on the recommendations made by last year's committee.

a) This Committee suggests that the recommendation in paragraph #1 of this Committee's last year's report which says "...that bids be obtained from three sources and range from 8 to 16 pages, including a cover, typesetting and photographs...bids should range from 300 to 500 copies." should continue to be followed in obtaining bids for the Conclave program.

b) We highly recommend continuing the policy that the profit/loss from the Conclave program be placed into the current

year's State Officers Account.

c) The Chairman of this committee did not obtain a copy of the state directory as recommended in Section #3 of last year's

report.

d) Due to unusual circumstances this committee did not work as closely with the Appointed State Officers as we would have liked to, but we hope that next year this Committee and the Appointed Officers will work more closely together.

This year's Committee would like to make the following recommendations:

l. Although it was not done last year, we recommend that next year the information about Conclave program ads should be included with the Conclave registration packet. The information for ads should also be published in the State Newspaper.

2. This Committee strongly recommends that in future years the Chairman of this Committee, if possible, be the State Scripe/Treasurer. This we feel would help with the preparation

of the Treasurer's Summary.

3. We recommend that in the future this Committee be made up of past Budget and Finance Committee Chairmen who have not reached their majority as well as others in the same area as the Chairman who are willing and able to serve on this Committee.

This committee would also like to include a report on the Conclave Program (Appendix I). As required by our Statutes we have included a listing of the fiscal impact of the Standing Committees (Appendix II), a summary of the Treasurer's Report

(Appendix III) and a proposed budget for the next term (Appendix IV).

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes this report has no fiscal or physical impact.

Brother Jim Smith, Hollywood Chapter, objected to Recommendation C and 3 and Brother Sean Smith, Hulbert Chapter, objected to Recommendation 2. After Brother Shannon Locklear, American Crusaders Chapter, moved to accept the report as read, discussion was heard and a vote was taken on Recommendations C, 2 and 3. ATHLETICS COMMITTEE REPORT

To the Delegates of the 56th Annual Conclave:

- We, the members of the 1988-89 Athletics Committee would like to submit the following report and recommendations for your approval.
- a) In accordance with the 1987-88 Athletics Committee report the Delegates of the 1987-88 Conclave voted to abolish the State All-Zone sports award, because of the unfair advantage it gave to a smaller Chapter in a large Zone.

- b) This Committee also feels that it is a very good idea for Chapters around the state to hold and participate in various sports tournaments, as was stated in the 55th Annual Conclave Athletics Committee report.
- c) This Committee firmly believes that in order to function properly it needs an Athletics Director. Keeping this in mind at last year's Conclave Dad Bob Wallace was appointed Athletics Director.
- d) This Committee feels that in future track and field competitions there should be a Junior and Senior division, in the shot-put and discus events. The Junior age group would be from 13-15 and the Senior age group would be from 16-20. We feel the competitions should be held at the same time as the normal competitions in order to save time. We discussed this with the Director of Trophies, and he believes the entrance fees will cover the cost of \$25.00 each for the two extra trophies.
- e) In addition, this Committee feels that the State Athletics Committee Chairman should be from the same area as Conclave is being held and an assistant or co-chairman in the area of Mini-Conclave. We also believe the Executive Officer should seriously consider the appointment of an Athletics Director, or an assistant, from the same area as Conclave is being held. These appointments would be a great help in the acquiring of officials, so the rules of the Florida High School Athletics Association will be better implemented in all events where applicable.

Pursuant to Section 5.01 of the Statutes of the Florida DeMolay Association, this report is fiscally and physically feasible.

In closing this Committee would like to thank Dad Bob Wallace for all of the time and effort he has put into coordinating the athletics at this Conclave.

All committee reports submitted by the chairmen of the various committees have been reviewed and have complied with the appendix supplied by last year's Committee. Each report has satisfied the requirements as described by the Constitution and Statutes of this Association.

Concerning the effectiveness of last year's Committee recommendations:

- a) Recommendation #1 which stated that the State Parliamen-tarian/State Jurisprudence Committee Chairman, should develop an outline to be used as a guideline in writing a committee report. This was done by the 1987-88 Committee and this Committee Chairman and made understanding the report less mind boggling and much easier.

Charter

The several Chapters of the Order of DeMolay in Florida are hereby granted authority to form an organization to be styled "The Florida DeMolay Association". This Association shall exist to further the programs and ideals of the Order of DeMolay, to promote the progress and well-being of the Chapters and their Members, and to provide a medium for education and communication throughout the Order in Florida; provided, that this Association shall have no authority over the particular chapters within this Jurisdiction; provided further, that this Association shall have the authority to exercise jurisdiction over State Master Councilor's Representatives and other such officers as now exist, or may in the future be created, by the Executive Officer.

To accomplish these goals, the Florida DeMolay Association shall be authorized to exact such Constitution, Statutes and resolutions as shall not be in conflict with the policies or orders of the Executive Officer, and shall have been approved in advance by the Board of Administration.

The "Board of Administration" is hereby created to serve the Florida DeMolay Association, its officers and members, in a general advisory capacity. It shall review and approve all legislation to come before the Association, shall have original jurisdiction over any proposition of grievance arising out of the activities of the Florida DeMolay Association, and shall have the authority to construe or dispense with any provision of the Constitution, Statutes of rules of competition, when it shall deem such action to be in the best interest of the Order of DeMolay or this Association, and shall perform other such duties as may be enjoined upon it by the Executive Officer, and shall serve at his Pleasure.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA DEMOLAY ASSOCIATION

Article I Name, Purpose, Colors

- Section 1: This organization shall be known as the Florida DeMolay Association, Order of DeMolay (hereinafter, Association)
- Section 2: The purposes for which this organization are formed are exclusively educational, religious, and charitable. Not by way of limitation, such purposes shall encompass guidance of DeMolays in their physical, mental, and religious development through specific programs in the fields of physical education, sportsmanship, citizenship, public speaking and the arts, all designed to promote a keen sense of the principles of good citizenship, sportsmanship, respect for parents and fellowman, and to establish and instill a philosophy of life that will sustain the members of each Chapter in the future.
- Section 3: The Official colors of this Association shall be the royal colors of Purple and Gold.

Article II Allegiance and Authority

- Section 1: The Association, its officers, advisors, and the individuals of member chapters of this Association pledge their allegiance to the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay, its Grand Master, Grand Secretary and the Executive Officer in the State of Florida.
- Section 2: This body is constituted with the power and authority to set forth laws and to set forth standards in the inter-chapter relations; and to levy fees and dues, provided that these measures are in harmony with the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay and the Charter under which this Association operates.

Article III Membership and Representation

- Section 1: The members of this Association shall be all the Chartered Chapters; and those holding Letters Temporary of the Order of DeMolay located in the State of Florida
- Section 2: The members of this Association shall meet annually for the purpose of conducting business, electing officers, holding sports and ritual competition and all other activities provided for in the statutes of this Association.

- Section 3: In order for the delegation of a member chapter to attend and register, the said delegation must be accompanied by a certified member of the Advisory Council or a Master Mason, approved by the Deputy Zone Director for each ten (10) DeMolays or fraction thereof in attendance.

 No Chapter shall be allowed to register its delegation if said Chapter has not paid in full, all assessments due this Association.
- Section 4: Each member Chapter Shall be entitled to be represented by three (3) delegates at the Annual Conclave. This Association shall provide by Statute the manner of voting at delegate sessions.

Article IV Officers

- Section 1: The officers of this Association shall consist of the State
 Master Councilor, Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor,
 State Junior Councilor, State Paliamentarian, State Scribe/Treasurer, State
 Senior Deacon, State Junior Deacon, State Senior Steward, State Junior Steward,
 State Chaplain, State Marshall, State Orator, State Standard Bearer, Seven State
 Preceptors, State Committee Chairmen, and all others selected by the State Master
 Councilor and/or Executive Officer of the State of Florida.
- Section 2: The State Master Councilor, Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, and State Parliamentarian shall be elected during the general business session of this Association at Conclave assembled each year, and these officers shall serve until their successors are installed.
- Section 3(a): The State Scribe/Treasurer shall be appointed by the Board of Administration from a list of two or more nominees submitted to it by the State Master Councilor. The State Scribe shall be appointed at the Annual Mini-Conclave of this Association, or as provided by Article IV, Section 5(c). He shall not be eligible to run for an elected office for a period of one year after his appointment. All nominees for the office of State Scribe/Treasurer must be a Past Master Councilor, have completed the Leadership Correspondence Course, and be a Representative DeMolay. All canidates for State Scribe/Treasurer must have a personal savings and/or checking account.
- Section 3(b): The State Scribe/Treasurer shall work with an Advisor who is satisfactory to the Board of Administration. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall obtain three (3) or more bids for the cost of printing the Conclave Proceedings before the registration of said Conclave.
- Section 4: All other State Officers shall be filled by appointment of the State Master Councilor. These officers shall serve until the close of the following Conclave.
- Section 5(a): No candidate shall be elected to a State Office who would reach the age of 21 years prior to June 1 of the year following his election. No State Officer may attend an out-of-state school or reside outside the State of Florida during his term of office. Any violation of these provisions shall automatically create a vacancy in the office.

- Section 5(b): A vacancy in an appointed State Office may be declared by the State Master Councilor after an evaluation of that State Officer's performance.
- Section 5(c): A vacancy in an elective State Office may be declared by the State Master Councilor after an evaluation of the State Officer's performance, and with approval of the Executive Officer. A vacancy will also occur in the office of State Scribe/Treasurer upon the recommendation and approval of the State Master Councilor to the Board of Administration.
- Section 6(a): In the event of death, resignation, or removal of a State Councilor, each lower State Councilor shall advance to the next highest office and a State Junior Councilor shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.
- Section 6(b): In the event of death, resignation, or removal of the State Parlimentarian, a new State Parlimentarian shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.
- Section 6(c): In the event of death, resignation, or removal of the State Scribe/Treasurer, a new State Scribe/Treasurer shall be appointed by the State Haster Councilor, subject to the approval of the Executive Officer.
- Section 6(d): Vacancies in all other State Offices shall be filled by Appointment of the State Master Councilor.
- Section 7(a): A Candidates letter of intent to run for elective State Office must include the following statement: "I have read and am familiar with the Charter, Constitution, and Statutes of this association."
- Section 7(b): All canidates for the office of State Parilamentarian must also include the following statement: "I have read and am familiar with ROBERTS RULES of ORDER ."

Article V Committees

- Section 1: The following committees shall be considered as standing committees of this Association:
 - 1. Executive
 - 2. Nominations
 - 3. Guidance
 - 4. Credentials
 - 5. Jurisprudence
 - 6. Budget and Finance
- 7. Athletics
- 8. Ritual
- 9. Public Relations and Publications
- 10. Hembership
- 11. Knighthood
- 12. Constitutional Revisions

Article VI Amendments

- Section 1: The procedure for amending this Constitution is as follows:

 (a): It shall be the responsibility of any Florida DeMolay proposing an amendment to this Constitution to provide for the distribution of said proposal to the Constitutional Revisions Committee, Jurisprudence Committee, Elective State Officers, Executive Officer, Board of Administration, and member Chapters of this Association not less than 60 days prior to the opening session of Conclave.
 - (b): The proposed amendment, after the approval of the Jurisprudence Committee and the Board of Administration, shall be presented for consideration on the floor of Conclave. Upon the approval of two-thirds (2/3) of the delegates present and voting, it shall take effect upon the close of the Annual Conclave.

Statutes

Chapter 1 Revenue

Section 1.01: Each chapter shall pay as dues the sum of fifteen (\$15.00) dollars for each initiate to the Florida State DeMolay Association, Inc., and shall be payable with the form 10 reporting the initiation. In addition, for each member listed on the annual report, the chapter shall pay a per capita tax as follows:

For the period ending: 12/31/89 \$.30 12/31/90 \$.15

and thereafter this per capita tax will be abolished.

Section 1.015: The revenue derived from the initiation fee in section 1.01 shall be distributed as follows:

33 1/3% General Account

33 1/3% Savings Account

33 1/3% As provided in Ch. 4. Section 4.04

Chapter 2 State Conclave

- Section 2.01: There Shall be ritual competition, athletic competition, State Sweetheart competition, election of State Officers and any other business for the good of the Order or this Association.
- Section 2.02: There shall be ritual competition conducted under the direction of the Executive Officer's Personal Representative for Ritual, assisted by the Chairman of the State Ritual Committee. This competition shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the Original Tournament of Champions.
- Section 2.03: There shall be athletic competition conducted at State Conclave under the direction of the State Director of Athletics assisted by the State Athletics Committee. The State Director of Athletics, appointed by the Executive Officer, shall appoint for each competition referees for each event who shall use the playing rules established by the Florida State High School Association.
- Section 2.04: There Shall be State Sweetheart competition at State Conclave. The rules and regulations as determined by the Executive Officer shall be published in the proceedings of the year's Conclave.
- Section 2.05: For the purposes of participation in the activities and/or competitions sanctioned by this Association, any person who has not yet reached the age of 21 years before June 1 of the year of the Conclave shall be entitled to participate as an active DeMolay, and at any subsequent level of competition; provided that they have not been certified as an advisor.

- Section 2.06: There shall be a Mini-Conclave, to be held annually in or about the month of January at a specific time and place to be determined by the Executive Officer and State Master Councilor. The Mini-Conclave shall consist of:
 - a. Such meetings of the State Officers as are deemed necessary by the State Master Councilor.
 - b. All state committees shall be required to meet and report to the State Master Councilor, and
 - C. Any other Ritual and/or Athletic competitions and social activities which are deemed necessary and appropriate.
 - D. The Installation of the State Scribe/Treasurer.

Chapter 3 Elections

- Section 3.01: Any qualified DeMolay who desires to run for an elective office of this Association shall send a letter of intent to the Executive Officer and Chairman of the Nominations Committee, prior to the opening session of Conclave. The letter of intent will be read aloud before the DeMolay delegation by the Nominations Committee Chairman prior to elections.
- Section 3.02: All candidates must be residents of the State of Florida for at least six months prior to the election and shall be members in good standing of a member Chapter of this Association. All candidates for elective State Office must possess at the time of filing of their letter of intent, proof of being a Representative DeMolay, Past Master Councilor and a graduate of the Leadership Correspondence Course, and copies of such proof shall accompany said letter. Only those brothers who submit a letter of intent for the office of State Treasurer shall be eligible to run for said office. All candidates for the office of State Parlimentarian shall have read, and be familiar with, ROBERT'S RULES of ORDER.
- Section 3.03: All Candidates for the Office of State Master Councilor must be at least 17 years of age and have been a member of this Order for at least two (2) years prior to june 1 of the year of his election.
- Section 3.04: A candidate shall not cause any distribution of materials written or oral pertaining to his candidacy before he has submitted his letter of intention to the proper persons (as stated in Chapter 3, Section 3.01). The date of submission shall be determined by the letter of intent's postmark. He will be authorized to distribute calling cards only. This card will be no larger than the standard DeMolay dues card in overall size, and will contain no information other than the name, address, phone number, titles and/or honors and the title of the office being sought by the candidate. This card will be the only authorized material which may be distributed in his behalf at Conclave or at any other time.
- Section 3.05: The election of officers of this Association shall take place at the discretion of the State Master Councilor during a regular business session at each Annual State Conclave.
- Section 3.06: No two (2) elected State Officers shall be from the same member Chapter of this Association.

- Section 3.07: It being the purpose of the order of DeMolay to develop leadership and a sense of responsibility among individual members of the Order, Elected State Officers or State Scribe/Treasurer of this Association shall not succeed themselves or ever hold a lower ranking office with the exception of a committee chairmanship.
- Section 3.08: The election of officers shall be in order of rank, the highest being first, the order as provided by this Constitution, by secret ballot of those entitled to vote, as otherwise provided in the Constitution, at each Annual Conclave of this Association. A majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary for a candidate to be elected.
- Section 3.09: Any qualified candidate who is not elected to the office for which he has submitted a letter of intent may be nominated for a lower office from the floor during elections, subject to the restrictions of Chapter 3, Section 3.02 and Section 3.07.
- Section 3.10: The ballots for the Election of officers shall be prepared by the State Scribe/Treasurer for each Annual Conclave. The ballots shall be to each delegate entitled to vote, prior to the opening of elections, and the ballots shall be cast with the full name of the candidate for the particular office legibly written thereon; ballots shall be folded only once. Blank ballots, illegible ballots and those otherwise deviating from the proper form provided herein shall be tabulated as abstentions.
- Section 3.11(a): Each member Chapter shall be entitled to be represented by three (3) delegates at the Annual Conclave. Each delegate shall have one vote in all matters brought on the floor of the Conclave, providing he has been certified by his Chapter Advisor and has been registered with the Credentials committee prior to the opening session of Conclave In the event that less than three (3) delegates from a Chapter are in attendance at Conclave, any or all of the absent delegate votes may be given to a remaining delegate from that "Chapter. In order to accomplish this, the Chapter Advisor must submit written authorization to the Credentials Committee before the opening business session of Conclave.
- Section 3.11(b): All of a Chapter's delegates must be members of said chapter.
- Section 3.12(a): Every Past State Master Councilor who has not reached the age of twenty-one (21) years and is properly registered will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave.
- Section 3.12(b): No past State Master Councilor shall be entitled to claim a chapter's absent delegate votes.
- Section 3.13: Each Chapter delegation shall elect a delegation chairman During all business sessions, the vote of the delegation shall be announced by the chairman of the delegation with the exception of secret ballot for State Officer elections.

Chapter 4 Duties of State Officers

- Section 4.01: The State Master Councilor shall be the duly elected head of this Association, and it shall be his duty to perform all duties which naturally pertain to such an office or which may devolve upon him from time to time.
- Section 4.02 The State Master Councilor shall preside at the Annual Conclave and work in conjunction with the Board of Administration. He shall also work with the Executive officer and his Staff in making arrangements of said Conclave.
- Section 4.03: The State Master Councilor shall appoint all committee chairmen of this Association, and in consultation with each chairman, appoint the committee members.
- Section 4.04: The State Master Councilor shall have an expense account equal to 33 1/3% of the amount collected for each initiate reported to Florida State DeMolay Association, Inc. on a form 10 which shall be used for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of his and other State Officers duties, with the State Master Councilor's approval.
- Section 4.05: The State Master Councilor shall in person or by Personal Representative, visit each chapter in this state at least once during his term of office so far as is applicable.
- Section 4.06: The State Master Councilor Shall report in writing to the Association at each Annual Conclave, all of his Official Acts, whether performed in person or by Personal Representative.
- Section 4.07: The Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Parliamentarian and State Scribe/Treasurer The State Master Councilor when so ordered, assist the State Master Councilor in every way possible in the discharge of his duties, and shall report to this Association, in writing, at each Annual Conclave, all of their official acts.
- Section 4.08: The State Scribe/Treasurer's records shall be subject to an audit conducted by the Executive officer.
- Section 4.09(a): The State Scribe/Treasurer shall record the minutes of the Annual of this Association and any official State Meeting. He shall then within sixty (60) days have aforesaid minutes, together with the Constitution and Statutes of their latest revision published together with the rules and regulations of the Sweepstakes Competition, and distributed as follows:

 1. One copy to each member Chapter of this Association;
 - 2. Copies to the Executive Officer, one copy to each member of the Supreme Council residing in the state, and one copy to any advisor appointed by the Executive Officer in a supervisory capacity, including the Board of Administration;
 - One copy to the State Master Councilor, the Deputy State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, and State Parliamentarian;

- 5. One copy to each of the State Committee Chairmen; 6. one copy to each jurisdiction in Region 3 of the International Supreme
- Council, sent to the Executive Officer.
- Section 4.09(b): The State Scribe/Treasurer, with the approval of the State Scribe/Treasurer Advisor, shall have the authority to correct any grammatical and typographical errors as he deems necessary and appropriate.
- Section 4.09(c): The State Scribe/Treasurer shall work with an advisor who is satisfactory to the Board of Administration. The State Scribe/Treasurer shall obtain three (3) or more bids for the cost of the Conclave Proceedings before the registration of said Conclave.
- The State Scribe/Treasurer shall under the direction of The State Master Councilor and/or the Association Conduct all correspondence of this Association.
- The State Scribe/Treasurer shall keep and maintain a true copy of the Constitution and Statutes of the Florida DeMolay Association. He shall Section 4.11: also supply a copy for the Board of Administration and the Executive Officer of Florida.
- The State Treasurer shall make disbursement for this Association with the approval of the Executive Officer. The Section 4.12 State Treasurer shall make an itemized report of all transactions in connection with his office at the Annual Conclave.
- The State Parliamentarian shall decide the consitutionality of all motions, resolutions, and proposals presented by the Standing Committees, Section 4.13 or from the floor of Conclave, when so required by the State Master Councilor.

Chapter 5 Committees

- All committees shall be responsible for reporting on the fiscal and physical feasibility of their proposals. Section 5.01:
- The duties of the Jurisprudence Committee will be to determine the Constitutionality of all motions, resolutions, and proposals presented Section 5.02: by the Standing Committees or from the floor of Conclave. The State Parliamentarian shall serve as the chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee.
- The duties of the Nominations Committee shall be: (a) to receive and review letters of intent filed by person(s) seeking Section 5.03: qualification as (a) candidate(s) for elective State Office; upon completion of the review the chairman shall notify the prospective candidate of approval or shall notify him of deficiencies therein; such review and notification shall be completed within twenty (20) days after receipt of the letter by the Chairman; a candidate may submit an amended letter of intent which shall also be reviewed as specified herein above; (b) to, at the time of election, present to the Delegates a list of qualified candidates. No candidates for elective office may serve on this committee.

- Section 5.04: The Membership Committee shall study and promote an active program for the acquisition of eligible youth in this Jurisdiction.
- Section 5.05: The duty of the Credentials Committee shall be to validate the credentials of all delegates to Conclave in accordance with Chapter 3, Sections 3.11 and 3.12 of the Statutes. This committee shall be responsible for arranging the seating of said delegates.
- shall be to promote the image of DeMolay through programs of public interest and to put the name of DeMolay before the general public. It shall also be the duty of this committee to inform and assist member Chapters in the Annual DeMolay Week Program. This committee shall oversee any publication of this Association and any related programs.
- Section 5.07: The State Ceremonies Committee shall promote uniformity in the ritual of the Order of DeMolay throughout this Association, and shall recommend to the Association for approval, procedures for the performance of ritualistic matters not specifically set forth in the Ritual of Secret Work of the Order of DeMolay and methods of receiving introducing, and accommodating those who are entitled to recognition in all conclaves, meetings, and public ceremonies of the Association. It shall also develop review and revise any State Ceremonies which may be used by this Association.
- Section 5.08 The State Athletics Committee shall work with the State Sports Director in acquiring qualified, unbiased judging officials for all state athletics competitions. They are also to make certain that no advisors shall judge their own chapters, they shall also review and submit any proposals to the State Master Councilor.
- Section 5.09: The duties of the Constitutional Revisions Committee shall be to recommend pertinent and necessary revisions to the Constitution and Statutes.
- Section 5.10: The Knighthood Committee shall maintain communications between Priories in this Jurisdiction and assist the development of Knighthood. The Knighthood Committee shall also coordinate Knighthood programs with current ISC and Jurisdictional programs.
- Section 5.11: The Budget and Finance Committee shall review the financial status of this Association and report the same to the Delegates of the Annual Conclave. Any proposals, including committee recommendations, containing fiscal impact shall be submitted to this committee for its review and recommendation. It shall also be the committee's responsibility to put together the Conclave Program and such advertisements necessary for its production. This committee shall also present a proposed comprehensive budget for this Association to the delegates and, upon approval present the proposed budget to the Executive Officer. The expenditures of this Association shall not exceed its income from Conclave to Conclave.
- Section 5.12: The Guidance Committee shall be the duly appointed State Master Councilor's Representatives of the several Zones. This Committee

will function at the will of the State Master Councilor. It shall act in an advisory capacity to relay to the State Master Councilor the suggested needs of the individual Zones and the State as a whole. This committee shall physically meet at least twice before the opening session of the Annual Conclave.

Section 5.13: The Executive Committee shall be composed of the chairmen of all the Committees, the Elected State Officers, State Scribe, and all Past State Master Councilors who have hot reached their majority. It shall be chaired by the State Master Councilor, and shall meet at his discretion.

- Section 5.14: The State Master Councilor shall announce the names of the appointed Committee Chairmen, appointed State Officers, and State Master Councilor's Representatives at the last business session of the State Conclave. The names of the Chairmen shall be published, with the exception of the State Credentials Committee Chairman in the current proceedings of this Association.
- Section 5.15: The State Master Councilor shall have the authority to appoint one Advisor to each committee with the consultation of the committee chairman and the director, if one has been appointed.
- Section 5.16: It shall be the duty of each committee to submit to the State Master Councilor a report upon request. It shall also be the duty of each State Committee Chairman to gather suggestions and recommendations from the member Chapters and combine them with his own ideas and submit them to the State Master Councilor as a tentative agenda thirty (30) days prior to Conclave.
- Section 5.17 The final committee reports shall be typewritten and submitted to the State Scribe/Treasurer no later than the beginning of the last business session at each Conclave.
- Section 5.18: A final report from each State Committee must be read and passed by a simple majority vote of the delegates prior to the close of Conclave.
- Section 5.19: The State Master Councilor Shall have the power to establish and abolish additional committees (with the exception of Standing Committees) as he deems necessary.
- Section 5.20: Each individual State Committee shall be responsible for implementing the recommendations made by that committee and approved by the delegates at the most recently concluded Conclave. The Executive Committee shall oversee and coordinate this implementation.
- Section 5.21 All committees shall meet at least three (3) times a year prior to the opening session of conclave and submit minutes of these meetings to the State Master Councilor at the Annual Conclave."
- Section 5.22 All committees are to physically meet at least three (3) times a year prior to the opening session of Conclave and submit minutes of these meetings to the State Master Counclior at the Annual Conclave.

Chapter 6 State Master Councilor's Representatives

- "Section 6.01: It will be the duty of each State Master Councilor's Representative to promote Florida DeMolay and its Communications to the members of this Association.
- Section 6.02: It will be the duty of each State Master Councilor's Representative to provide monthly reports to the State Master Councilor, Guidance Committee Chairman, and State Officer in charge of his Zone, concerning the progress, activities, and needs of his Chapter and Zone.
- Section 6.03: The State Master Councilor's Representatives will be required to attend all meetings of the Guidance Committee of this Association.
- Section 6.04: The State Master Councilor's Representatives shall act as Personal Representatives of the State Master Councilor to serve on his behalf when no other ranking State Officer is present.
- Section 6.05: Each Zone will have one (1) State Master Councilor's Representative for every three chapters or fraction thereof. The State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor to serve at his will.
- Section 6.06: State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be obligated to attend both Mini-Conclave and Conclave.
- Section 6.07: All State Master Councilor's Representatives shall be required to begin working on their L.C.C. and R.D within 30 days after their appointment, if they have not previously completed them. Proof of which must be furnished by his Chapter Advisor.

Chapter 7 State Appointed Line Officers

- Section 7.01: State Appointed Officers of this Association shall include: the State Senior Deacon, State Junior Deacon, State Senior Steward, State Junior Steward, State Orator, State Sentinel, State Chaplain, State Marshall, State Standard Bearer, State Almoner, State First Preceptor, State Second Preceptor, State Third Preceptor, State Fourth Preceptor, State Fifth Preceptor, State Sixth Preceptor, State Seventh Preceptor.
- Section 7.02: It shall be the duty of each State Appointed Officer to promote the Florida DeMolay Association and its communications to the members of this association.
- Section 7.03: It shall be said officers duty to provide monthly reports to the State Master Councilor concerning the progress, activities and needs of their chapter and zone.

- Section 7.04: Said officers will be required to attend all meetings of the Public Relations and Publications committee.
- Section 7.05: Said officers shall act as Personal Representatives of the State Master Councilor when no other ranking officer is present.
- Section 7.06: Said officers will be required to memorize their portions of the Ritual Ceremonies.
- Section 7.07: Said officers shall be required to begin working on their L.C.C. and R.D. within thirty days after their appointment if they have not previously completed them.
- Section 7.08: said officers shall be obligated to attend both Conclave and Mini-Conclave.

Chapter 8 Amendments

- Section 8.01: These Statutes Can be amended by a simple majority vote of the delegation, and such amendments may be substituted any time prior to the first business session of Conclave, and need only be submitted to the delegates of the Chapters in Attendance at the Conclave.
- Section 8.02: These amendments shall, upon the approval of the Board of Administration and the delegation, take effect immediately.

L. Gordon Cooper Trophy for Membership - Awarded to the Chapter initiating the greatest number of new members during the calendar year.

Virgil I. Grissom Trophy for Most Improved Chapter - awarded to the Chapter whose standing in the Sweepstakes improved by the largest percentage over the previous year.

Charles A. Scott Trophy for Chapter RD Excellence - Awarded to the Chapter having the highest percentage of its Active DeMolays holding the Rd Award.

Saints John Preceptory L.O.H. of the

Past State Officers' Association

The Past State Officers' Association of the Order of DeMolay in Florida, is hereby established subject to the following guidelines.

Purpose

The purpose of this Association shall be solely to aid and support the Order of DeMolay in Florida in any way(s) deemed appropriate by its membership.

Membership

The membership of this Association shall consist of all Past Elected State Officers, Past State Scribes and Past State Scribe/Treasurers of the Florida DeMolay Association who have reached the age of 21.

Meetings

This Association shall meet at least once each year at the Annual Conclave of the Florida DeMolay Association.

Officers

This Association shall have a Chairman, elected by a majority vote of the members present at the annual meeting, who shall serve for a term of one year. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of this Association.

State Sweetheart Rules for Sweethearts, Female Guest, and Chaperones General Rules

Single female guests under 21 will adhere to the State Sweetheart rules and and dress code contained herein and abide by the curfew set by the Executive Officer.

All female guests must abide by the rules of the Executive Officer, Conduct Committee, and by the Sweetheart Committee.

There must be an adult female chaperon (for every three (3) female guests) to attend any Conclave function. Chaperones must be at least 25 years old. NO EXCEPTIONS! Chaperones must room with the female guests during Conclave.

Chaperones should conform to all rules and regulations, including the

dress code.

All female guests and their chaperones must be officially registered through an active DeMolay Chapter with the approval of the Advisory Council.

- In the case of problems or questions, contact the State Sweetheart 1. Chairman or Committee ONLY! DO NOT contact the Hotel Staff.
- All Sweethearts must be sponsored by and Active DeMolay Chapter. They 2. must be a Current Chapter Sweetheart. One entry per Chapter will be accepted.
- Sweetheart Contestants must be between the ages of 15-20 as of July 1 of the year they compete and attending a Florida School or be a High 3. School graduate. They must wear mane tags at all times and are required to attend the first briefing session.
- All Sweethearts should exemplify the highest DeMolay ideal of 4. womanhood and conduct themselves in a ladylike manner.
- Sweetheart Contestants can not be engaged to be married, annulled or 5. divorced.
- Sweetheart Contestants must have their parents' (or guardians) 6. approval in writing and submitted to the State Sweetheart Chairman before the beginning of Conclave.
- Each Sweetheart Contestant and her chaperon must be registered and staying at Conclave (in the same room) the entire Session. The chaperon 7. must know where her Sweetheart is at all times. A Sweetheart chaperon may not chaperon anyone else. We must adhere to a one-on-one basis.
- Sweetheart Contestants will be permitted to run no more than twice 8. for State Sweetheart. Any girl who has been State Sweetheart is ineligible to run again.
- A suitable 5x7 photo, preferably in color, must be submitted to the 9. State Sweetheart Chairman the first day of Conclave. No other size photo will be accepted, and the photo will not be returned. (photo with crown and sash will be permitted.)

- 10. Pictures, cards, brochures, or any other campaign materials WILL NOT be distributed by a Sweetheart or for her by others. Sweethearts or female guests will not campaign in any way for candidates running for DeMolay State Office
- Any infraction of these rules by anyone may cause a Sweetheart Contestant to be disqualified from competition.
- 12. Sweetheart Contestants may not leave the hotel premises without a chaperon and permission slip form a member of the State Sweetheart Committee.
- 13. No DeMolay will be permitted to enter a Sweetheart's room without having a Sweetheart Committee member present.
- 14. Sweetheart Contestants are not permitted in the vicinity of the ballot box while DeMolays are voting for State Sweetheart.
- 15. Each DeMolay will vote for three (3) girls for State Sweetheart, indicating their first, second, and third choice. Each first place vote will receive three (3) points; second place will receive two (2) points; third place will receive one (1) point. The girl receiving the highest number of points will be the State Sweetheart. There must be three different, eligible Sweetheart manes on each ballot.
- 16. A member of the B.O.A. shall be present at the counting of the votes to assist the Sweetheart Committee.
- 17. The State Sweetheart can not serve concurrently as a Chapter Sweetheart. She must resign from her Chapter Sweetheart position upon elections as State Sweetheart.
- 18. The State Sweetheart must notify the State Sweetheart Chairman within 15 days of her election who her official Chaperon will be; the Chaperon must meet with the Chairman's approval. The State Sweetheart must be chaperoned at all times!
- 19. It is the duty of the State Sweetheart to keep the State Sweetheart Chairman informed, at all times, of her activities.
- 20. Any engraving done on the State Sweetheart trophy and crown box will be paid for immediately by the State Mother's club on presentation of a Bill the the State Scribe/Treasurer.
- 21. The State Sweetheart is responsible for the crown, sash, cape, trophy, and trophy box which will be returned to the State Sweetheart Chairman, in the same condition they were received in, at the beginning of Conclave or upon request.
- 22. State Conclave registration for the outgoing State Sweetheart will be paid by the Florida DeMolay Association. (contact State Sweetheart Chairman.)

- If the State Sweetheart marries, becomes engaged to be married, moves out of Florida, or leaves for 30 days, she must resign and return all 23. State paraphernalia. The 1st runner-up will replace her.
- The State Sweetheart should be willing and able to travel to various parts of Florida to DeMolay activities, and also, to State DeMolay 24. functions where invited!

Dress Code

- Contestants should at all times be dressed in good taste and 1. appropriately for the occasion.
- Dresses are recommended for most functions. It is understood that at all times bras, panties, slips and nylons will be worn with all dresses. 2.
- Backless dresses are acceptable - must have bra and slip. Extremely tight clothing, skirts or dresses with high slits or low cut tops are 3. unacceptable! When in doubt, don't wear it!
- Slacks or dress jeans (not bare midriff or hiphugger type) may be worn to sports events or special activities. Shorts, (not short shorts) will 4. be permitted only if the occasion warrants (sports, pool parties, etc.).
- Bikini bathing suits (in good taste) may be worn. Robes must be worn 5. over suits to and from the pool.
- Formals will be worn at all formal functions -- Formal Introductions, Grand Banquet, or upon the request of the State Sweetheart Committee. 6.
- Chapter sashes and crown will not be worn at State Conclave. Sashes will be provided. Sashes will not be worn with slacks or shorts. 7.
