The State Master Councilor declared the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter in a state of recess at 5:46 PM.

MINUTES OF THE BUSINESS SESSION Monday, JULY 09, 2007

The State Master Councilor declared the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter out of a state of recess at 8:00 PM.

The State Master Councilor then declared the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter open for Nominations.

Brother Ian Berry nominated Brother Anthony Pickren for the honorable office of State Junior Councilor:

"Brother Anthony Pickren was initiated on December 18, 2002 ever since he has been a very active DeMolay. He has received many honors and awards such as his R.D., L.C.C.'s, and Chevalier. He is also a Past State Scribe. Anthony has many great qualities that are too numerous to count and if Ryan Jones was up here I am sure that he would call Anthony a "Switch hitter," and besides being my personal rep and right hand man he has constantly helped, guided and made sure that other DeMolays succeed, and even though there is nobody running against Anthony, I want to assure you in the most solemn manner in my power that I have full confidence in his abilities to do what is right for the Order of DeMolay."

Brother Anthony Pickren then read the following acceptance speech.

"I accept Ian's Nomination for the office of State Junior Councilor and I accept the duties and responsibilities that come with this great office. A Motion and Second was made to elect Brother Anthony Pickren because of there being only one candidate. The State Scribe cast a unanimous ballot, the motion passed, and Brother Anthony Pickren was elected the new State Junior Councilor at 2:44 PM.

The State Master Councilor then closed elections for the office of State Junior Councilor and opened elections for the office of State Senior Councilor.

A Motion and Second was made to elect Brother Jorge Landa because of there being only one candidate. The State Scribe cast a unanimous ballot, the motion passed, and Brother Jorge Landa was elected the new State Senior Councilor at 2:45 PM.

The State Master Councilor then closed elections for the office of State Senior Councilor and opened elections for the office of State Master Councilor

A Motion and Second was made to elect Brother Travis Parker because of there being only one candidate. The State Scribe cast a unanimous ballot, the motion passed, and Brother Travis Parker was elected the new State Master Councilor at 2:47 PM.

The State Master Councilor then closed elections for the office of State Master Councilor.

The State Master Councilor then declared the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter in a state of recess at 3:00 PM.

The State Master Councilor Travis Parker gave his final remarks

"Distinguished guests, Brethren, and others in attendance. I stand before you tonight as the newly elected State Master Councilor of the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter. For the last 2 years Florida DeMolay has been growing at an alarming rate, we are force to be reckoned with not only in our region, but now Internationally. We are #2 in the country in positive membership growth. We Have revived this state to the prestige it once was. We now don't have to worry

about if we have enough DeMolays to carry out an initiation at Conclave. Now we worry if we are going to have a big enough hotel! This conclave we have 106 DeMolays in attendance. This is a big step since in previous years we haven't even reached 50 DeMolays. This conclave has been proof that with hard work and determination we have brought in the members. With this abundance of growth, we need more leaders. That is one of the obstacles Florida DeMolay is facing, for every obstacle, there is a solution. Our Solution is the Mini LTC program. These leadership training conventions will build new leaders and improve qualities of the leaders we already have. APPENDIX B: REFERENCE MATERIAL

Charter of the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter

By directive of the Executive Officer, a Jurisdictional State Chapter is hereby chartered.

The State Chapter shall be governed first by the Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of DeMolay International, second by directives of the Executive Officer, and third by its Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). The State Chapter shall function through Jurisdictional Staff to promote and achieve the Jurisdictional Management Plan and directions of the Executive Officer.

The State Chapter shall be inclusive of all components and members of Florida DeMolay.

Take due notice thereof, and govern yourselves accordingly.

Standard Operation Procedures of the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter

The members of this State Chapter shall be every member of every Chartered Chapter, and those holding Letters Temporary of the Order of DeMolay located in the Jurisdiction of Florida. All members of the individual Chapters will be dual members of the State Chapter.

Any member who is initiated in, or moves to an area where there is no Chapter to readily accept him, the said member will be a part of the Florida-at-Large Chapter. The assembled Florida-at-Large Chapter members will meet the first day of the Annual State Conclave and Mini-Conclave, to elect the delegates of said Chapter.

The members of this State Chapter shall meet at least biannually at the Annual State Conclave and Mini-Conclave for the purposes of conducting business, electing officers, holding athletic and Ritual competitions, and other activities that are seen fit by the Conclave Director.

The Elected Officers of this State Chapter shall consist of the State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Scribe and Illustrious Knight Commander who also holds the office of Deputy to the State Master Councilor. This will not be a progressive role.

The State Senior Councilor and State Junior Councilor shall be elected at the Annual State Conclave assembled each year. The State Senior Councilor shall automatically ascend to the office of State Master Councilor at the Conclave following his election. These officers shall serve until their successors are installed, or until they resign or are removed.

The State Scribe shall be elected from a list approved by the Executive Staff from two or more nominations submitted to them by the State Master Councilor. He shall not be eligible to run for elected office at Conclave while serving as State Scribe. All nominees for the office of State Scribe must meet the qualifications of an Elected Officer.

The State Scribe shall work with an Advisor who is satisfactory to the Executive Staff. The Advisor must be a member of the Jurisdictional Staff.

All candidates for the office of State Scribe shall submit a letter of intent to the State Master Councilor and the State Chapter Dad two weeks prior to the opening night of Mini-Conclave.

No candidate shall be elected to a State Office who would reach the age of twenty one (21) prior to his installation. No State Officer may attend an out-of-state school or reside outside the State of Florida during his term of office. Any violation of these provisions shall automatically create a vacancy in the office.

A vacancy in an elected State Office, with the exception of Illustrious Knight Commander, may be declared by the State Master Councilor with the approval of the State Chapter Dad and Executive Officer. A vacancy will also occur in the State Scribe position upon the recommendation and approval of the State Master Councilor, State Chapter Dad, and Executive Officer.

In the event of death, resignation or removal of a State Officer, each lower State Councilor shall advance to the next highest office and a State Junior Councilor shall be appointed by the State Master Councilor, subject to the approval of the State Chapter Dad and Executive Officer.

Any qualified DeMolay who desires to run for the Elected Office of State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor and State Scribe of this State Chapter, with the exception of the Illustrious Knight Commander, shall send a Letter of Intent to the Executive Officer, State Chapter Dad, the State Master Councilor, and the Chairman of the Nominations Committee no less than 20 days prior to the opening of said Conclave. The Letter Of Intent will be read aloud before the Florida DeMolay Delegation by the Nominations Chairman prior to elections. Letters of Intent may be in the form of email.

All candidates must be residents of the State of Florida for at least six months prior to the election and shall be members in good standing of a member Chapter of this Jurisdiction. All candidates for an Elected State Office must possess at the time of filing their Letter of Intent: proof of being a recipient of the Representative DeMolay Award, a Past Master Councilor, and having completed the five modules of the Leadership Correspondence Course. Copies of such proof shall accompany the said letter.

The candidates for State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor and State Junior Councilor shall show, to the approval of a Ritual Evaluator, or panel of Evaluators designated by the Director of Ritual, his proficiency in the Opening and Closing Ceremonies and Initiatory Degree in the Ritual of Secret Work for his sought Office. The criteria for the approval of said evaluation shall be determined by the Director of Ritual before the elections of the said office.

A candidate's Letter of Intent to run for an elected State Office must include the following statement: "I have read and am familiar with the Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of DeMolay International, and the Charter and Standard Operating Procedure of the Florida Jurisdictional Chapter." It shall also include the statement "I am proficient in the Ritualism of the office I am seeking." Candidates seeking office at conclaves, and their parents, shall be interviewed by the Executive Staff prior to conclave. The Executive Staff will provide final guidance on a candidate's suitability for office, and refer them to the voting delegation at conclaves.

All candidates for the office of State Master Councilor must be a high school graduate or its equivalent, and have been a member of this organization for at least two (2) years prior to seeking said office. Any candidates of said office from the Florida-at-large Chapter need the approval of the Executive Staff.

A candidate shall not cause any distribution of materials, written or oral, pertaining to his candidacy before he has submitted his Letter of Intent to the proper persons. The date of submission shall be determined by the Letter of Intent's postmark. He will be authorized to distribute business size calling cards only. These cards will contain no information other than the candidate's name, address, phone number, and emblem of the Order of DeMolay, titles and/or honors, and the title of the office being sought by the candidate. This card will be the only authorized material which may be distributed on his behalf at the Annual State Conclave or at anytime.

The election of Officers of this State Chapter with the exception of the Illustrious Knight Commander shall take place at the discretion of the State Master Councilor during a regular business session at the respective conclaves.

The election of Officers shall be in order of rank, the highest being first, by secret (written) ballot of those entitled to vote or by unanimous acclimation if there is only one DeMolay running. A simple majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary for a candidate to be elected.

Any qualified candidate, who is not elected to the office for which he has submitted a Letter of Intent, may be nominated for a lower office from the floor during elections. The ballots for the election of Officers shall be prepared by the State Scribe for each Annual State Conclave. Blank ballots, ineligible ballots, and those otherwise deviating from the proper form provided herein shall be tabulated as abstentions.

Each member Chapter shall be entitled to three (3) votes and to be represented by up to three (3) delegates at the Annual Conclave. Each delegate shall have one vote in all matters brought on the floor of Conclave, providing he has been certified by his Chapter Advisor and has been registered with the Credentials Committee prior to the Opening Session of Conclave. In the event that less than three (3) delegates from a Chapter are in attendance at Conclave, any or all of the absent delegate votes may be given to a remaining Delegate from that Chapter. In order to accomplish this, the Chapter Advisor or designee must submit written authorization to the Credentials Committee before the opening business session of Conclave.

All of a Chapter's delegates must be members of said State Chapter.

Every Past Elected State Officer, who has not yet reached the age of majority before the opening of Conclave, and who is properly registered, will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave.

The State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Scribe, and Illustrious Knight Commander will be entitled to one (1) delegate vote on all matters at the Annual Conclave. The State Master Councilor will be given one (1) delegate vote only to be used in a tie breaker circumstance.

Each Chapter Delegation shall elect a Senior Delegate before the opening of Conclave. The vote of the Chapter Delegation shall be announced by the Senior Delegate with the exception of a secret (written) ballot.

The State Master Councilor shall be the duly elected head of this State Chapter, and it shall be his duty to perform all duties which naturally pertain to such an office or which may devolve upon him from time to time.

The State Master Councilor shall preside at the Annual State Conclave and Mini-Conclave.

The State Master Councilor shall appoint all State Officers that are not elected and the State Committee Chairmen of this State Chapter. In consultation with each chairman, the State Master Councilor shall appoint the committee members.

The State Master Councilor shall announce the names of the appointed Committee Chairman and Appointed State Officers, at the last business session of the State Conclave. The names of the Chairmen shall be published in the current proceedings of this State Chapter.

When a vacancy in any Committee chairmanship occurs, it is the duty of the State Master Councilor to appoint a new chairman.

The State Master Councilor shall have the power to establish and abolish additional committees (with the exception of standing committees) as deemed necessary.

It is the duty of the State Master Councilor to ensure an Elected State Officer makes an official visit, in person, to each Chapter in this Jurisdiction, at least once during his term of office.

The State Master Councilor shall report in writing to the State Chapter at each Annual State Conclave his entire official acts, whether performed in person or by a Personal Representative.

The State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, State Scribe and Illustrious Knight Commander shall: represent the State Master Councilor when so ordered; assist the State Master Councilor in every way possible in the discharge of his duties.

The State Scribe shall record the minutes of the business sessions of the Annual State Conclave and any official Jurisdictional meetings. He shall then within sixty (60) days have the aforesaid minutes, together with the Charter and Standard Operating Procedure of their latest revision, compiled, published, and distributed as follows:

One copy to the Executive Officer and one copy to each member of the International Supreme Council residing in the Jurisdiction of Florida.

One copy to the State Master Councilor, State Senior Councilor, State Junior Councilor, and Illustrious Knight Commander.

The State Scribe, with the approval of the State Scribe Advisor, shall have the authority to correct any grammatical and typographical errors in the minutes and Standard Operating Procedure as he deems necessary and appropriate.

The State Scribe shall publish the Conclave Proceedings on the jurisdictional website before the next biannual Conclave.

The State Scribe shall keep and maintain a true copy of the Charter, and Standard Operating Procedure of the Florida DeMolay Chapter. He shall also supply a copy for the State Master Councilor, Chief of Staff, Director of Conclave, and Executive Officer of Florida at the Annual State Conclave.

The State Appointed Officers of this State Chapter shall include the officers necessary for the function of the State Chapter. The State Appointed officers shall assist the State Master Councilor in his work.

The State Master Councilor may add or remove committees as he sees fit with the approval of the State Chapter Dad.

There shall be an Annual State Conclave, held in or about the month of July at a specific time and place to be determined by the Director of Conclave, Executive Officer, and State Master Councilor.

There shall be an Annual State Mini-Conclave, held in or about the month of January at a specific time and place to be determined by the Director of Conclave, Executive Officer, and State Master Councilor.

There shall be Ritual Competition, Sports Competition, Election and Appointment of State Officers and any other business for the Good of the Order held at the Annual State Conclave and Mini-Conclave.

The Director of Conclave shall make decisions concerning the registration of chapters.

The SOP may be changed by vote of the delegates at any State Chapter meeting.

The State Master Councilor can amend the SOP if he sees fit with the approval of the State Chapter Dad.

Chapters around the state may institute any programs sanctioned by the Bylaws Rules and Regulations of ISC including a Pages program that they wish.

Florida Jurisdictional Chapter Committee Report Format

The purpose of the committees is to improve the environment, membership and participation in Florida DeMolay. Reports must be developed with those affected, including the Jurisdictional Staff. The following steps should be taken in preparation for preparing the final Committee Report:

1. List the names of the Committee members, and who attended each meeting of the Committee, including any Advisors who may have been present.

2. List the dates and locations of all meetings held by the Committee.

3. Report specifically on what Committee actions and discussions were held.

4. List any recommendations for the next committee and a short discussion of the reasoning behind each recommendation.

5. List the actions taken by the Committee that implemented the recommendations of the previous year's Committee. If no action was taken on previous recommendations, list the reasons why no action was taken.

6. The Committee Chairman, the Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee, the Committee Advisor, the respective Jurisdictional Staff, and the State Master Councilor sign these reports. Please make an appropriate signature line on the report for these signatures.

7. The report should be reviewed and approved (signed) by the Jurisdictional Advisor/Staff member who is the Director of any activity affected by the Committee report. (For example: Actions affecting the Ritual Committee should be approved/signed by the Director of Ritual.) The State Chapter Dad is to determine the proper protocols for approval which may include the Delegation approval. Once signed by the Jurisdictional Staff, the report is approved and in effect. Electronic Copy must be provided to the State Scribe to record and distribute the report. Failure to provide copy to the State Scribe vacates the report.

8. State Scribe includes report in the Proceedings.

Please keep in mind that an interim Committee report will be expected for approval by the Jurisdictional Staff at the Mini Conclave during your term of office. This interim report should consist of anything the Committee has done between the Chairman's appointment to the Committee and the said Mini Conclave. This interim report is to be provided in electronic form the

State Scribe and should be reviewed in preparing the final report for Conclave. Failure to provide electronic copy to the State Scribe vacates the interim report.

APPENDIX C: RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Conclave Rules

One of the best, most pleasant of the DeMolay year is our Annual State Conclave. Everyone will have a much more enjoyable time if we all obey a few ground rules.

Our Statutes prohibit behavior likely to bring disrespect upon the Order of DeMolay and conduct unbecoming that expected a member of our Order. Additionally, the Laws of the host city, the State of Florida and the United States, are to be obeyed at all times by everyone attending Conclave.

The following General Rules are for the protection of everyone at Conclave:

1. Our Statutes prohibit possession, use or consumption by active DeMolays at Conclave of beer, liquor or controlled substances, including but not limited to cannabis, hallucinogens or other substances defined as "Controlled" by Florida Law.

2. No tobacco products. The use of any tobacco products, cigars, cigarettes, snuff or chewing tobacco, will not be allowed by any active DeMolay during Conclave or at any other DeMolay function.

3. For your own protection and the protection of others, possession of firearms, fireworks, other explosives, switchblade knifes and other like items or materials are prohibited.

4. No active DeMolays are allowed on the floor where the Sweethearts are housed.

5. Dress for the evening meals will be shirt and tie, coats will be optional.

6. Shirt and tie are required for all Delegate Sessions and the General Opening. Dress for the banquet is formal or semi-formal.

7. Swimming suits are not allowed in the main lobby or in the video game room.

8. No Sweethearts or female guests are allowed in any active DeMolay room.

9. Any damage to the hotel room will be billed to the persons registered in the room.

10. Room occupants are responsible for incidental charges such as telephone calls out of the hotel, special TV charges.

11. Anyone observing breach of these rules shall immediately report the activity to the Conduct Room or Conclave Office.

In the event that the Conduct Committee determines that a breach of these rules has occurred in any area at Conclave, all persons involved will be subject to being immediately sent home. Provided, that if the event is an isolated occurrence and no actual or constructive knowledge of the breach or infraction can be attributed to all persons in the area, only those involved in the event will be sent home. If a person(s) are sent home, his/her parents are responsible for all transportation charges and will be immediately advised of the reason for the individual's expulsion from Conclave. No refund will be made to those persons sent home.

Sweetheart Rules

1. Each Chapter which is in good standing may submit a candidate for competition. By her election as a Chapter Sweetheart, the Chapter Sweetheart who meets the qualifications as listed in paragraph # 3, is entitled to participate in this competition. If she is not eligible or does not wish to run, the members of the Chapter may offer her position to an eligible past Chapter Sweetheart. Any eligible past or present Chapter Sweetheart must receive a majority vote of approval by the current members of her Chapter. Only one entry per Chapter.

2. Each candidate must submit a completed application form, qualification form and consent form to the State Sweetheart Coordinator/or designee prior to the formal opening of Conclave with all required materials (i.e., photo, medical release form, etc., including all necessary signatures and approvals.

Qualifications

1. Candidates must be a young lady at least 16 years of age, but not yet 21 on the first day of summer conclave.

2. Candidates must have approval of their parents/guardians, and Advisory Council Chairman/Chapter Dad.

3. Candidates must be a Past or current Chapter Sweetheart.

4. Candidates must be willing to travel to various parts of Florida and other jurisdictions if asked, with a Chaperone as defined in the Rules and regulations.

5. Candidates must work on a minimum of at least Part 1 of the DeMolay Leadership Correspondence Course at Conclave or prior to conclave.

6. Candidates cannot be or have been married or pregnant at the time of election or at any time during her term as State Sweetheart.

7. In the event that the State Sweetheart resigns, or is removed from office, the EO will determine if the position is to be filled or vacated for the remainder of that term. Only those applications properly submitted during the effected term will be considered.

Dress Code

1. Contestants should at all times be dressed in good taste and appropriately for the occasion.

2. Dresses are recommended for most functions. It is understood that at all times bras, panties, slips, and hose will be worn with all dresses.

3. Back-less dresses are acceptable must have bra and slip. Extremely tight clothing, skirts or dresses with high slits or low cut tops are unacceptable. When in doubt, don't wear it.

4. Slacks or dress jeans (not bare midriff or hip-hugger type) may be worn to sports events or special activities. Shorts (not short shorts) will be permitted only if the occasion (sports, pool parties, etc.) warrants.

5. Bikini bathing suits (in good taste) may be worn. Robes must be worn over suits to and from the pool.

6. Formals will be worn at all formal functions – Formal Introductions, Grand Banquet, or upon the request of the State Sweetheart Chairman.

7. Chapter sashes and crowns will not be worn at state conclave. Sashes will be provided. Sashes will not be worn with slacks or shorts.

Jurisdiction of East Florida

Joseph George Roberts 1959 (?) – 1964(?)

George Elmer Wilbur. He was of Jacksonville, Florida, an Advisor at American Crusaders Chapter. He was Duval County Superintendent of Schools**. His unexpected death in office in Oct, 1928 left Florida DeMolay leaderless. During the early part of his tenure, State Conclaves were held twice annually and SMCs were elected for six month terms. This seems to have ceased around 1927. One of his last official acts was to approve a "Central Florida Conclave" in early 1928, at the joint request and sponsorship of John M. Cheney and Seminole Chapters.

M. W. John Leroy Brandon. Junior PGM of the Grand Lodge of Florida at the time, he was apparently appointed by Grand Council, but he never seems to have assumed the duties of "EO". If this was due to a "failure to communicate", it would not be the last time. Dad Roy T. Lord resigned his brief tenure later over similar circumstances. Among other things, Mr. Brandon was Mayor of Clearwater, FL.

Judge Albert Peter Wiese of Tampa, Florida. A Charter Advisor of Paul Revere Chapter in Tampa. After months of confusion in Florida DeMolay he called a State Conclave, on his own motion, in 1930. Conclave Petitioned Grand Council for a "Deputy for Florida" and Judge Wiese was appointed. He was the Juvenile Court Judge in Tampa. He remained in charge until World War II again disrupted DeMolay and the State Association ceased meeting.

Post WW II the State was divided into multiple Jurisdictions. The State DeMolay Association however, remained unified through out this period. The Board of Administration, jointly appointed by the EOs provided the unified oversight needed.

Frank Lynn Rogers was Deputy for North Florida. From Jacksonville. 33rd Degree.

Judge Henry Ludwig Oppenborn Sr. was **Deputy for South Florida**. Bro. Oppenborn was a Justice of the Peace and was involved in at least one very notable legal case. When Judge Oppenborn resigned the South Florida Jurisdiction was divided in two, making three Jurisdictions in Florida.

Joseph G. Roberts was EO for Southeastern Florida. A member and officer of Allaphata Lodge in Miami. Worked in Dade County's civic administration.

Henry Leon Cooper was EO for Southwestern Florida. 33rd Degree.

The State was briefly united under **M. W. Roy Theodore Lord** in 1959(?), the first Senior Demolay to become EO. A Senior DeMolay of American Crusaders Chapter, he resigned when it became clear ISC wanted him to take charge of the entire State. He had only agreed to take North Florida. (George Ulee Lord Chapter is named after his father.) An Electrical Engineer, he worked for the Seaboard Airline Railroad and was also an Officer of Barnett Bank. His condensed Grand Lodge biography runs to four pages.

The south end of the State was then renamed "East Florida". The North End of the State was then renamed "West Florida" (The dividing line was roughly where Interstate 4 now lies.)

Joseph G. Roberts resumed leadership of "East Florida".

Stephen Beach Diamond became EO of "West" Florida. Past Grand Commander of Grand Commandry, KT of Florida. Past Most Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council, R & S M.

M. W. John Edwin Larson of Tallahassee was briefly EO. He had agreed to take over the entire State but died in office before the Jurisdictions were re-united.

Bro. Edward Hornsby, Director of Administration for Bro. Larson, was briefly "Acting EO", without ISC appointment. The State was unified again.

(Rev.) Duncan Laidlaw Gray of Tampa was appointed Deputy of the Supreme Council and EO. The former Chapter Dad of Owen A. Coile Chapter in Tampa, Dad Gray dealt with the problems of reuniting the State which had been divided for so many years. He replaced the Board of Administration with a State Advisory Council, and took other actions to unify the State under his administration. He resigned as EO and Deputy of ISC to enter the ministry of the United Methodist Church. [His Post-EO Ministerial Career: He earned his Doctor of Divinity degree. He held five assignments in the United Methodist Church of Florida, and served on several church related Boards of Directors. He raised millions of dollars to renovate the Florida United Methodist Home and oversaw the renovations. He also served as Chaplain to the Shriner's Crippled Childrens Hospital in Tampa. He is currently retired and living in Tampa. Inducted into the Hillsborough High Scholl Alumni Hall of Fame , May, 2007. His many Honorary Degrees include Florida Southern College.]

Glenn Benjamin Wittstruck of Sarasota became EO in 1967. A long time Advisor at Sarasota Chapter, and State Director of Administration before appointment as EO. (His daughter, Dee Dee, was State Sweetheart in 1965. She later married Rodrick Coy, First International Master Councilor.) Dad Wittstruck left Florida suddenly when he was diagnosed with terminal cancer in 1971, immediately after Conclave, and he passed away within six months.

G Lawrence Hunt of Hollywood became EO. State Director of Administration prior to his elevation. He is a Senior DeMolay of Rochester Chapter, Rochester, NY. Appointed on Halloween, 1971, he served until 1995. He served as Grand Master of ISC in 1983-84. By profession he was a Pharmaceutical salesman.

William B. Marti became EO. Living in Hollywood, Florida. A Senior DeMolay and an Insurance Salesman by profession.

M. W. Richard Edward Lynn became EO in 2004. The retired owner of Lynn Catering of Miami, Florida. Past Potentate and Recorder of Mahi Shrine in Miami.

Imperial Priory of Knighthood Grand Crosses of Honor

During the Imperial Priory of Florida years, 1966 – 1969, three Knighthood Grand Crosses of Honor were awarded by the Sir Knights of Florida, for support of Florida Knighthood, above and beyond the call of duty.
